1 PERSONAL DICTIONARIES

IMPORTING INTO A PERSONAL DICTIONARY

Importing lets you automatically add a list of words to a personal dictionary. To import terms, first select the appropriate dictionary from the list of personal dictionaries. Then choose **File** from the menu bar, and **Import into dictionary...** (on a Mac, click on **Import...** in the **Action** menu below the list of dictionaries). Antidote then asks for the location of the list to import. The list, in TEXT format, can be a simple list of words:

```
superhappy [Carriage return]
unremember [Carriage return]
...
```

It can also be a list of words followed by their syntactic category:

```
superhappy [Tab] Adj [Carriage return]
unremember [Tab] Verb [Carriage return]
...
```

→ Other information can also be imported. For more details, see [Importation format](#) (in the **Documents** folder in the Antidote directory on your hard disk).

The results of the import operation will be shown in a window. Antidote will tell you the number of words added, the number of words added that underwent morphological changes and the number of words rejected.

You can save the list of rejected words so as to edit them and import them later.

Antidote may detect missing information when it imports the file. If so, a yellow warning triangle will appear. Check whether the information that Antidote has automatically inferred and added is correct, and then click on the **Accept inflection** button.

IMPORT FORMATS

INTRODUCTION

This document presents the structure of the export and import files of Antidote's personal dictionaries.

STRUCTURE OF THE EXPORT AND IMPORT FILES

- Text format
- Each line must contain 1, 2 or 8 tokens separated by tabulations
- Lines beginning with “//” are ignored with some exceptions (see the sections [Word Language](#) and [Encoding](#))
- Empty lines are ignored.

Word Language

- To specify the language of the words to import, the following three identifiers are used :
 - FR: French
 - EN: English
 - ML: Multilingual (English and French)
- These identifiers can be used in two places:
 - Globally, indicating the identifier in parentheses at the beginning of the file in the following comment:

```
Name : DICTIONARY_NAME (LANGUAGE_IDENTIFIER)
```

- For each word, indicating the language identifier as the first attribute (see the section [Importing 8 tokens](#) below)
- If the language is unspecified according to the previous methods:
 - In multilingual Antidote, an import error will occur.
 - In monolingual Antidote, the default language will be that of Antidote.

Encoding

Antidote tries to guess the file's encoding based on the content and your system platform. You can also tell Antidote which encoding you are using without it having to guess: Use the special comment coding: at the beginning of the file followed by the encoding identifier.

Here are the encoding identifiers :

- mac_roman
- iso8859_15
- cp1252
- utf_8
- utf_16_le
- utf_16_be

Example :

```
// coding: utf_8
```

Importing One Token

If a line only contains one token, that token is considered the base form and Antidote infers the word category, and (if required by the category) word morphology or verb model. In multilingual Antidote, the word language must be globally specified at the top of the file with a special comment (see the section [Word Language](#))

```
BASE_FORM __END_OF_LINE__
```

Importing Two Tokens

If a line contains two tokens, the first token is considered the base form and the second is considered the category. Antidote infers the word morphology or verb model, if required by the category.

In multilingual Antidote, the word language must be globally specified at the top of the file with a special comment (see the section [Word Language](#))

```
BASE_FORM __TAB__ CATEGORY __END_OF_LINE__
```

Importing 8 tokens

If a line contains 8 tokens, these tokens are considered in the following order:

- Base form
- Category
- Inflection 1 field
- Inflection 2 field
- Inflection 2 field
- Inflection 2 field
- Attributes separated by +
- Definition
 - To introduce a new definition, insert the “◇” character
 - To introduce a new paragraph, insert the “” and “r” characters
 - For a multilingual word, it is possible to specify a definition for each language. All definitions are specified in the same field. The French definition must be preceded by the keyword `|FR|` and the English definition by the keyword `|EN|`.

Example:

|FR|Définition de « ABCDEFG »|EN|Definition of "ABCDEFG"

2 USING WITH YOUR OTHER SOFTWARE

WINDOWS

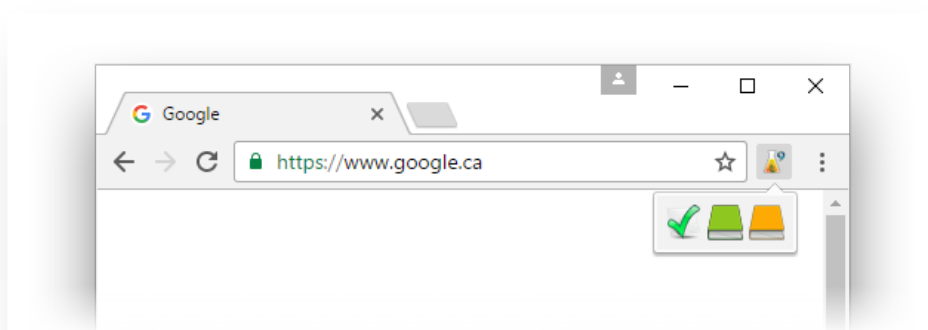
Antidote includes an advanced corrector, dictionaries and language guides, all of which integrate with your software to help you write. This guide will assist you in optimizing your use of Antidote with your other software.

You can call Antidote from your other software in any of the following ways.

Mechanism	Description
The Antidote Agent	The Antidote Agent is installed next to the Windows clock.
The context menus	Antidote appears in the contextual menus of many applications; all you need to do is right-click.
The toolbar	Access Antidote's language tools from the Antidote toolbar, displayed within some applications.
Copy and paste	Use the Clipboard to send Antidote the text to be corrected or the word to be looked up.
Drag and drop	Drag the text to be corrected or the word to be looked up directly into Antidote's language tools.

GOOGLE CHROME

Antidote integrates with Google Chrome by means of an extension. This extension adds an icon to the toolbar and certain elements to the context menu.

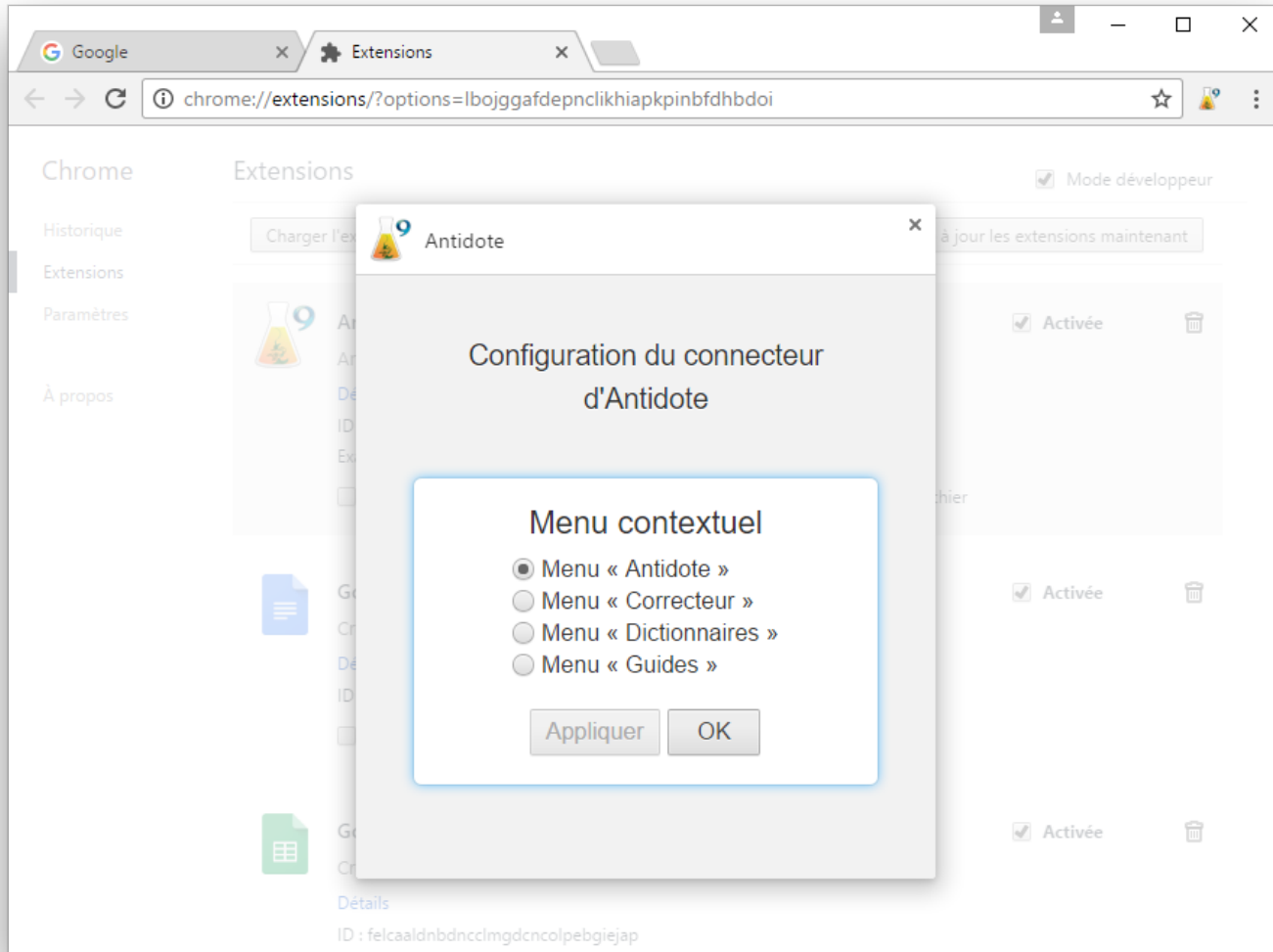


CHROME'S CONTEXT MENU

Antidote is accessed via a context menu. You can change the options offered in this menu as follows:

1. Right-click the Antidote icon in the toolbar.
1. Click Options.
1. Choose an option.

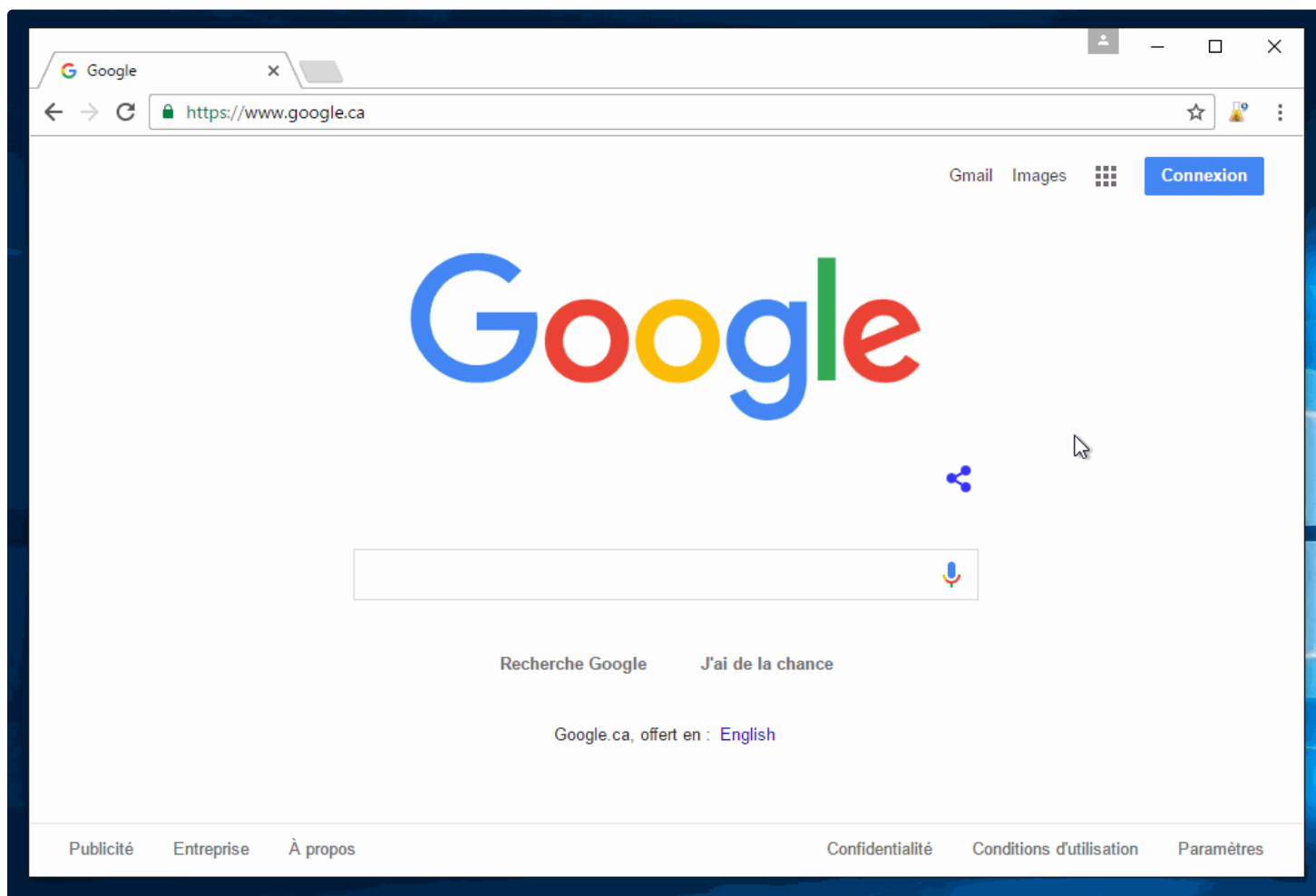
1. Click Apply.
1. Close the options tab.



UPDATING THE EXTENSION

Make sure you update the extension regularly

1. Click Chrome's personalize icon in the upper right corner.
1. Select the menu item "More tools" and then the sub-item "Extensions".
1. Check the "Developer mode" box .
1. Click the "Update extensions now" button.

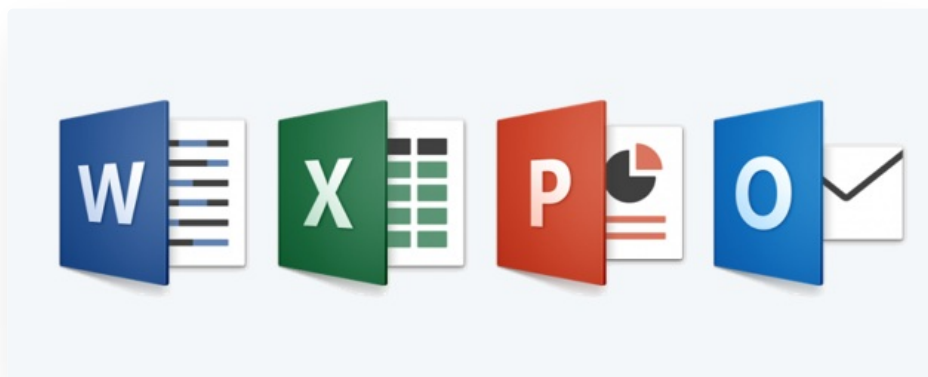

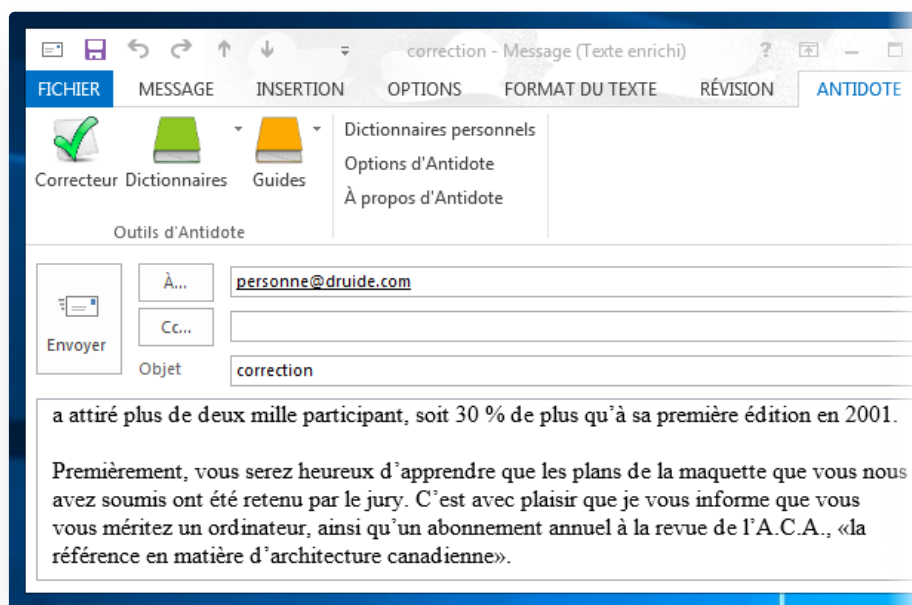
MICROSOFT OFFICE

When Antidote is installed, it automatically integrates with Word, Excel, PowerPoint and Outlook.



THE RIBBON

Antidote's resources are displayed in the Ribbon, under the Antidote tab.



You can access the various dictionaries and guides using the dropdown menus next to the icons. A few additional commands are found in the column to the right of the icons.

ADDING ICONS TO THE QUICK ACCESS TOOLBAR

1. Right-click on the icon of the corrector and select "Add to Quick Access Toolbar" from the context menu that opens.
1. Repeat with the icon for the dictionaries.
1. Repeat with the icon for the guides.

THE CONTEXT MENU

You can access Antidote's resources via the context menu. Right-click in the text to display the context menu, then select the desired resource.

FEATURES SPECIFIC TO POWERPOINT

You can call Antidote on the following selections:

- on text within a frame or on the entire frame;
- on all the frames in a slide (with **ctrl** + **A** or in Outline view);
- on a series of consecutive slides (in Outline view);
- on all the slides beginning with the current slide (by clicking on the background of the slide);
- on text in the presentation's notes.

FEATURES PARTICULAR TO EXCEL (TEXT CORRECTION)

When the corrector is called:

- If an empty cell is selected, Antidote will correct the entire sheet, including comments and charts.
- If non-empty cells are selected, Antidote will only correct those cells.
- If a chart is selected, Antidote will correct the titles and names on the chart's axes.

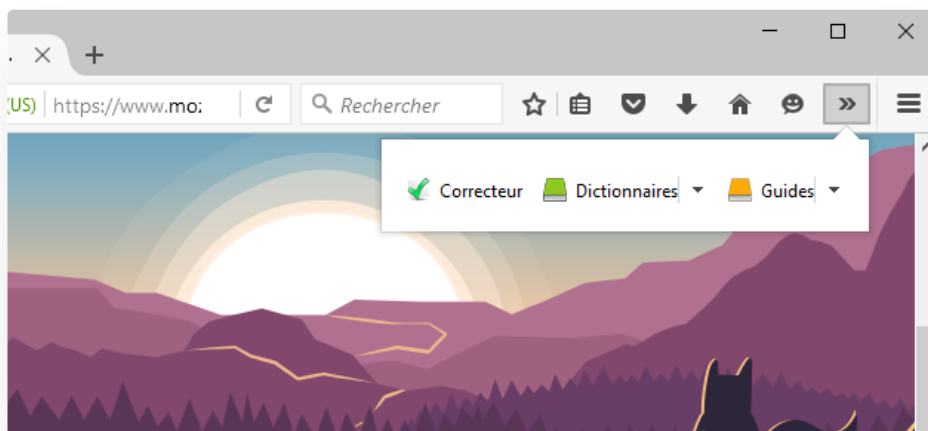
Note – Antidote cannot be called while editing a cell. Numerical cells are ignored.

FEATURES PARTICULAR TO OUTLOOK

To access Antidote's resources, first open a window for composing an email.

FIREFOX, THUNDERBIRD AND POSTBOX

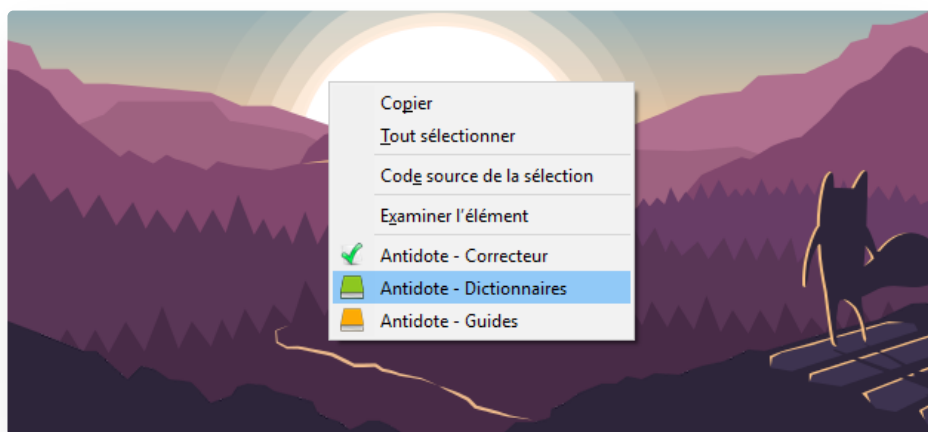
Antidote integrates with Firefox, Thunderbird and Postbox by means of add-on modules. These add icons to the toolbar as well as elements to the context menu.



ACCESSING ANTIDOTE'S RESOURCES

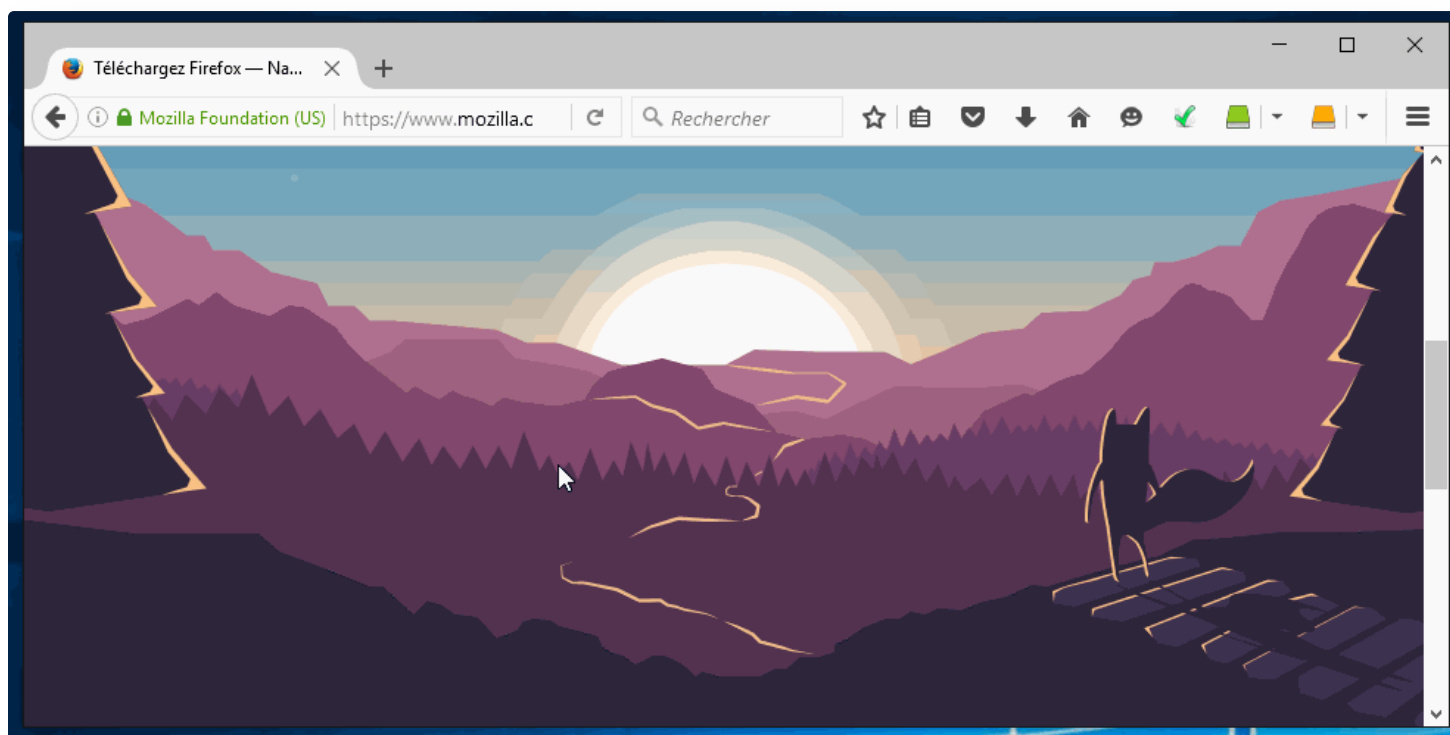
Select the text to correct or the word to be looked up, then call Antidote's resources by means of:

- the buttons in the toolbar
- the context menu (right click)
- the Tools menu (Thunderbird and Postbox).



UPDATING THE EXTENSION

1. Within the application, open the menu Tools> Add-ons.
1. Click the "Extensions" tab.
1. Click the tools icon.
1. Select the menu item "Search for updates".



LATEX

Antidote can process a document containing standard LaTeX commands.

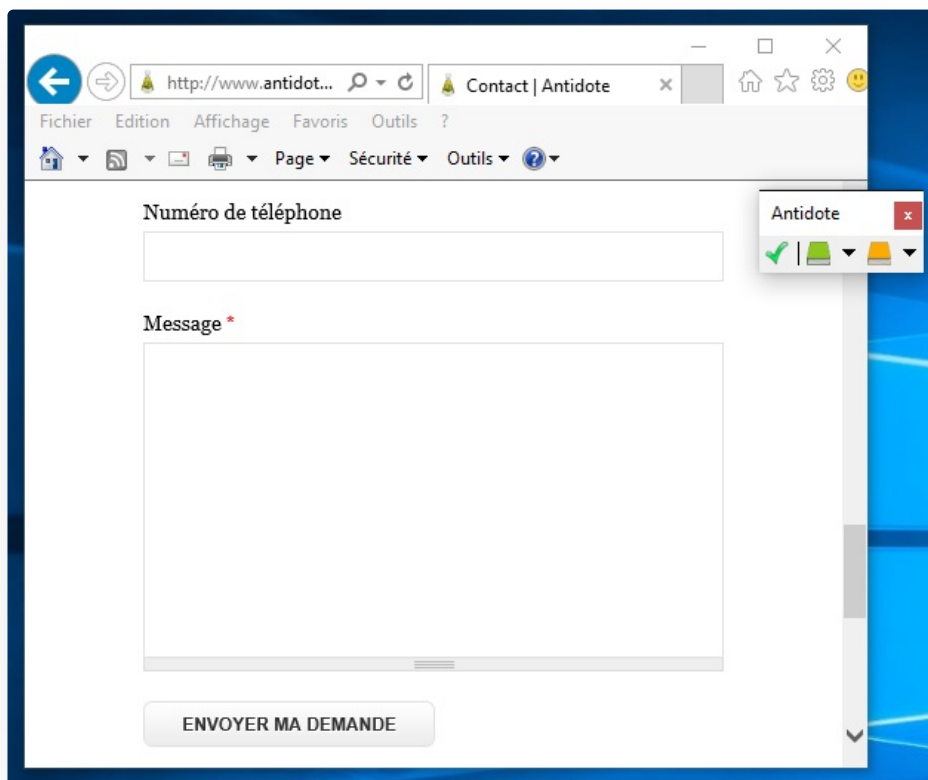
1. In the editor you use for your LaTeX documents, select the text to be corrected, and call Antidote by any of the usual methods (Antidote buttons and menus, Antidote's floating menu bar, the icon for the Antidote Agent, etc.).
1. Correct the document normally. The corrections should be reflected directly in your editor, without affecting the formatting instructions.

Notes :

- If your editor cannot connect with Antidote, you can copy and paste the text (including formatting instructions) into Antidote's internal editor, and then copy and paste the corrected version back into your editor.
- Antidote recognizes the 7-bit ASCII accent sequences used by TeX (eg `\`e`), but these can be difficult to correct. If so, you may have to make these corrections manually.
- Antidote will not interpret macrocommands.

INTERNET EXPLORER

Within Internet Explorer, Antidote's resources are accessed via the toolbar.



Select the text to correct or the word to be looked up, then call Antidote using the buttons in the toolbar.

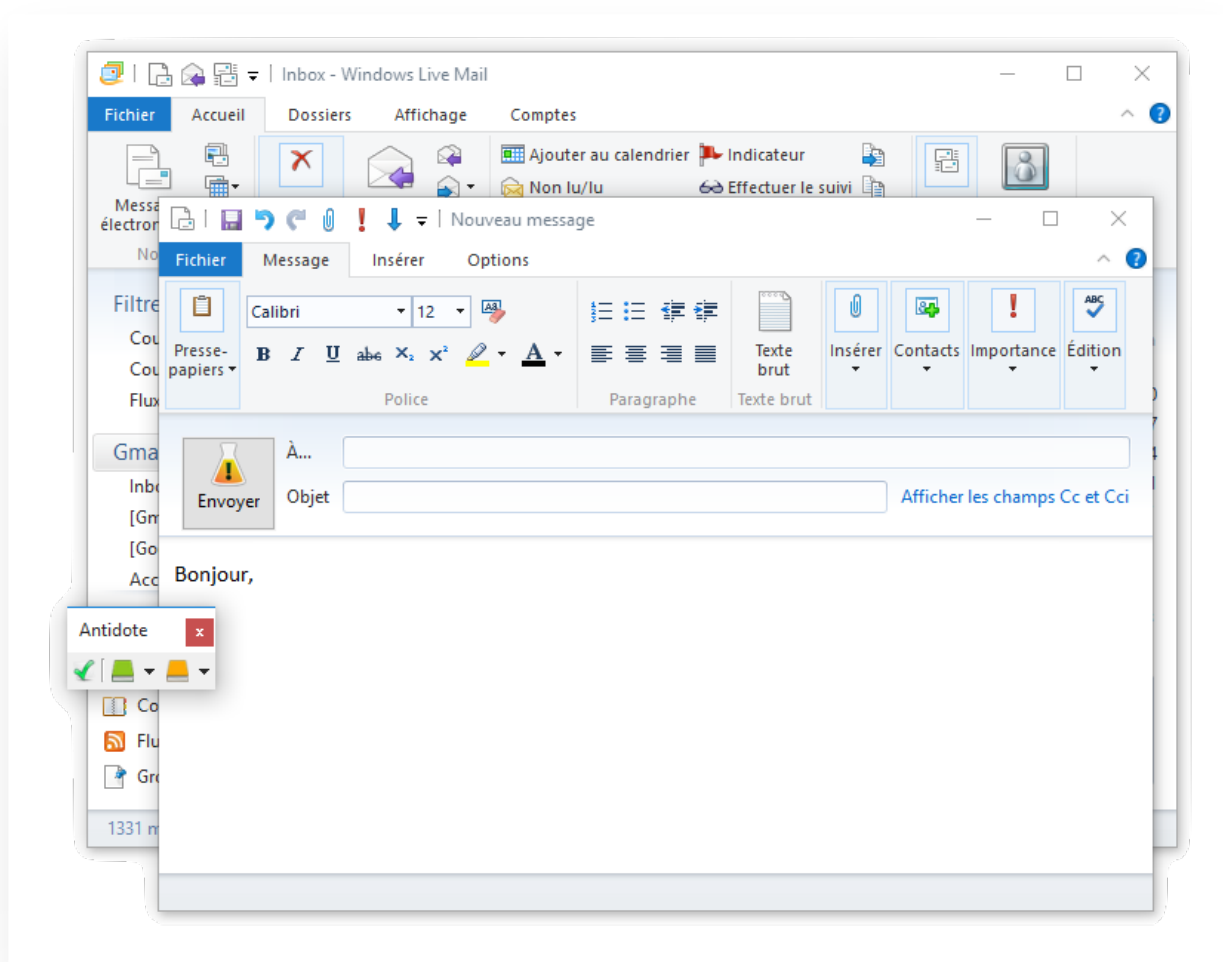
If the toolbar is not visible:

- Launch Antidote.
- Click on the Internet Explorer window to put it in the foreground.
- Open the [Antidote Agent](#) menu by right-clicking on the icon in the notification area (near the time).
- Choose "Show Antidote toolbar for Internet Explorer."

WINDOWS LIVE MAIL

Antidote is accessed within Windows Live Mail via the toolbar.

The display of the toolbar is managed by the [Antidote Agent](#) (the Antidote icon next to the time in the notification area).



ANTI-OOPS!

Anti-Oops! installs a highly visible Send button. When your message is finished, click that button so that Anti-Oops! can check whether any attachments are missing and call Antidote's corrector, if required, before the message is sent.

Note – The display of the Anti-Oops! button and any corrections that are made are determined by Antidote's settings. **Tip** – To send a message without Anti-Oops! intervening, click on Send while holding down the **ctrl** button.

GROUPWISE

Select the text to correct or the word to be looked up, then call Antidote's resources by means of:

- the buttons in the toolbar;
- the Tools menu;
- the context menu (right click).

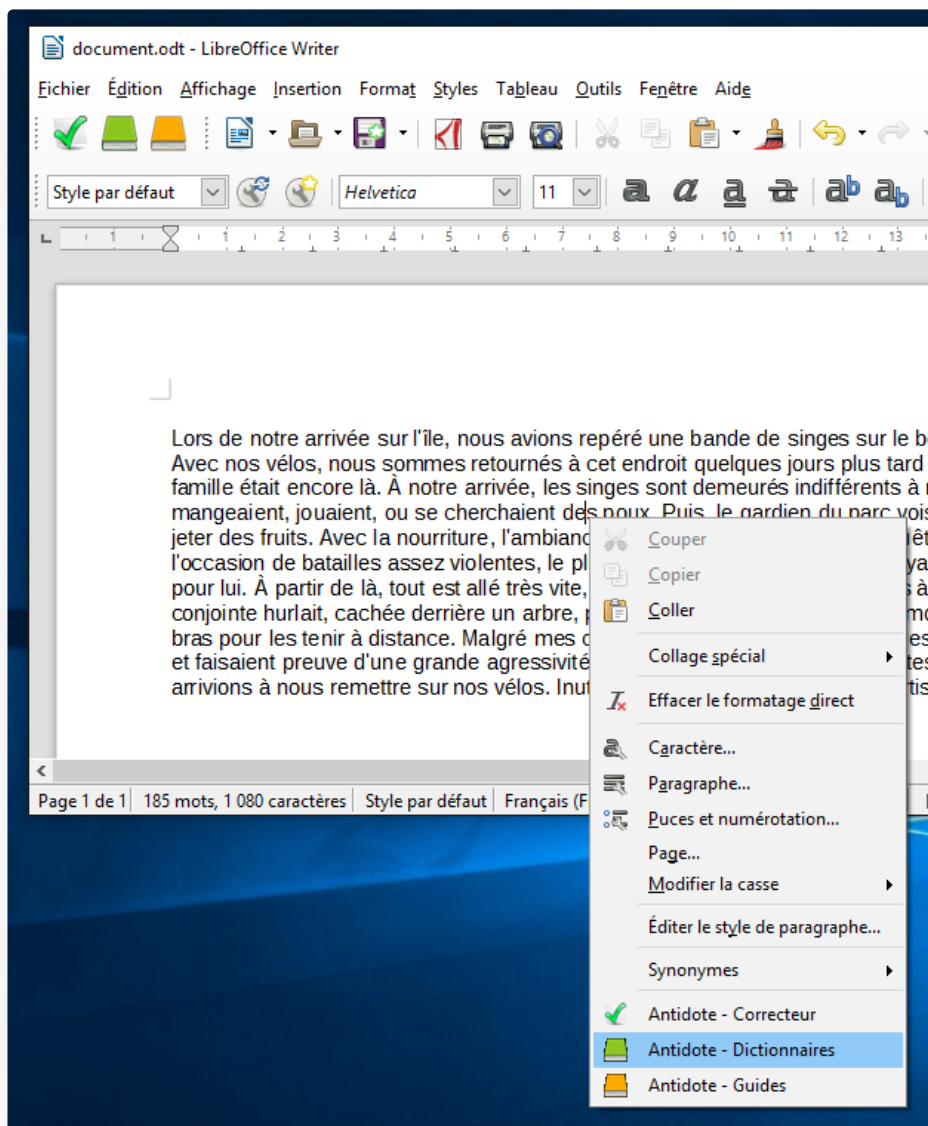
Note 1 – The context menu is not present in the HTML editor.

Note 2 – You can choose which Antidote commands appear in the Tools menu and the context menu; see the Antidote settings.

LIBREOFFICE

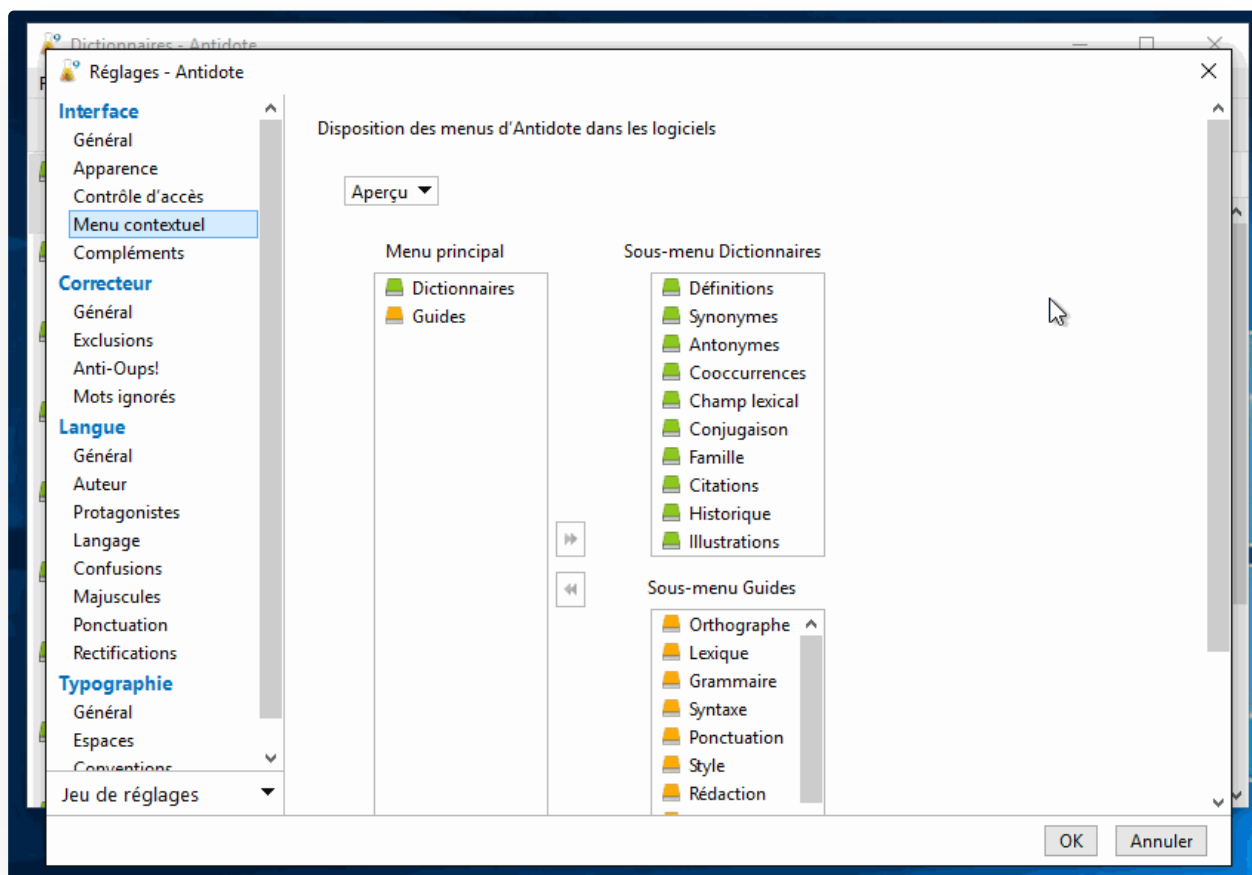
Antidote integrates with the Writer, Calc, Impress and Draw modules of LibreOffice.

To access Antidote, place the cursor at the desired location in the document, then call Antidote's resources using the buttons in the toolbar or the context menu.



CUSTOMIZING THE CONTEXT MENU

The context menu panel in Antidote's settings allows you to customize the context menu, e.g. by adding direct access to synonyms or conjugation.



WORDPERFECT

A WordPerfect document is composed of several structures, including the body of the text as well as different types of headers and footers. The corrector has to be launched separately on each structure to be corrected.

ACCESSING ANTIDOTE'S RESOURCES

After placing the cursor at the desired location in the document, you can call Antidote's resources in one of two ways:

- Click on the Antidote icon in the toolbar;
- Select the desired Antidote resource in the Tools menu.

Note — You can choose which Antidote commands appear on the Tools menu; see the Antidote settings.

ILLUSTRATOR, INDESIGN AND INCOPY

The following table shows how to call Antidote from Illustrator, InDesign and InCopy. For Illustrator, access via the context menu is replaced by shortcuts in the Edit menu.

CORRECTING TEXT WITHIN ILLUSTRATOR

- If a segment of text is selected, Antidote only corrects that segment.
- If the cursor is in a block of text, the correction starts at the sentence where the cursor is located and continues to the end of the block.
- If no block of text is selected, Antidote corrects the entire document.

Note - Antidote displays all corrected text blocks in sequence.

CORRECTING TEXT WITHIN INDESIGN

- If a part of the text is selected, Antidote only corrects that part.
- If the cursor is in a block of text, the correction starts at the sentence where the cursor is located and continues to the end of the block.
- If no block of text is selected, Antidote corrects the entire document.

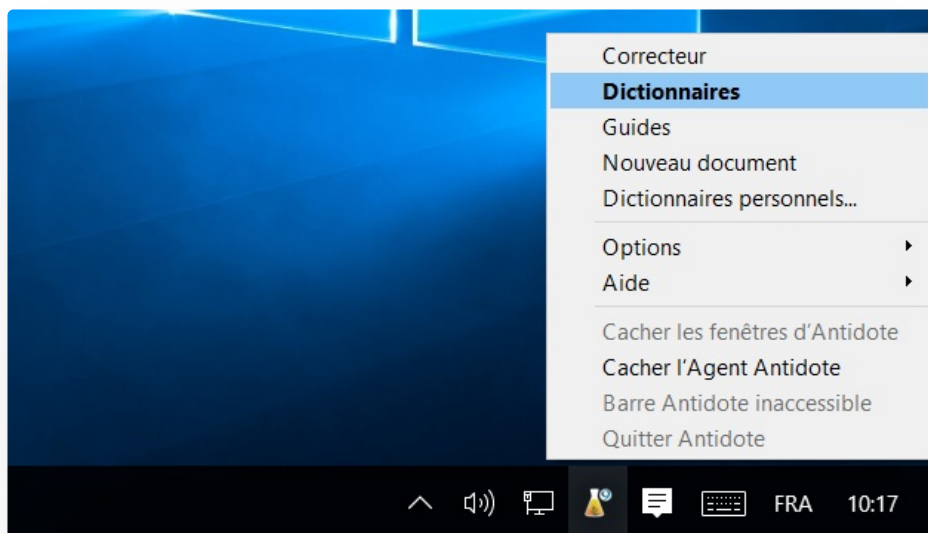
Note - Antidote displays all corrected text blocks in sequence.

CORRECTING TEXT WITHIN INCOPY

- If a part of the text is selected, Antidote only corrects that part.
- If no text is selected, Antidote corrects the entire document.

THE ANTIDOTE AGENT

The Antidote Agent is installed near the Windows clock. The Agent provides quick access to Antidote's resources.



USE

- With the **right** mouse button, click on the Agent's icon (the Antidote vial); a menu opens giving you access to Antidote's resources.
- To access Antidote's resources from WordPad or Notepad, place the cursor or make a selection in the desired location, then call the resources via the Agent.

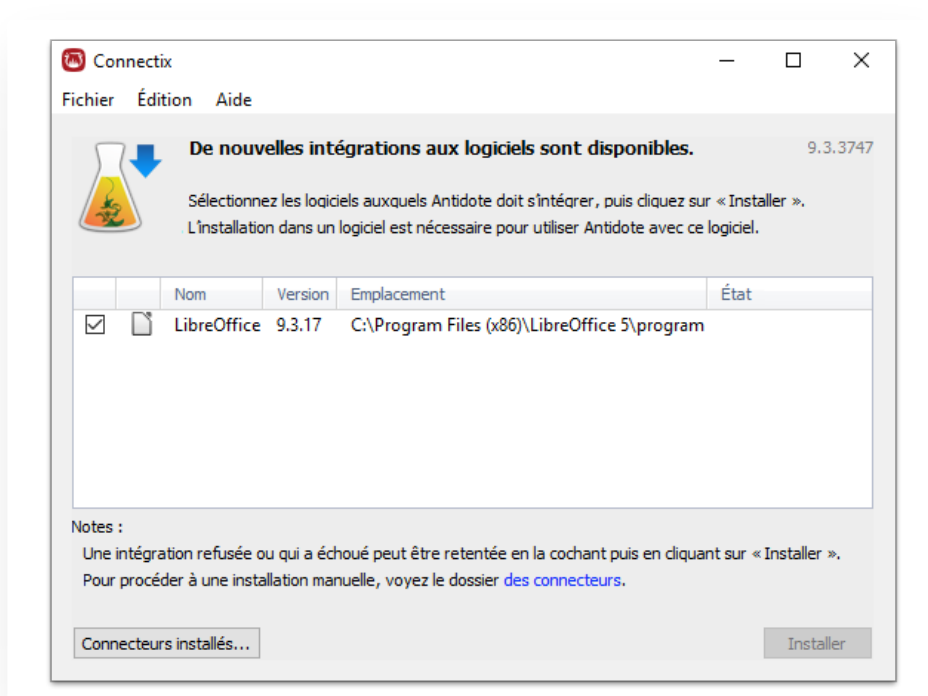
Note – if a program has a button bar for accessing Antidote, you can still use the Agent as another method for calling Antidote.

You can choose which Antidote commands appear in the Agent menu; see the Antidote settings.

INSTALLING ANTIDOTE'S CONNECTORS

Antidote automatically installs its connectors in the software you selected during Antidote's installation.

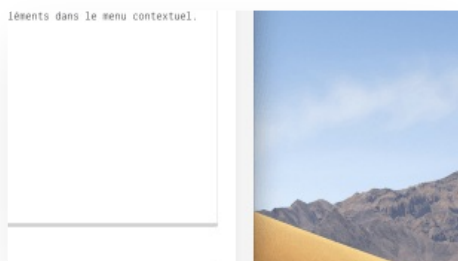
To reinstall Antidote in a given program, run Connectix (the integrator) by choosing "Install with your other software" under Antidote's "Help" menu.



Note – If automatic installation with Connectix does not work, click on the link to the connectors folder; detailed instructions for installing the connectors manually are found in the folder of each program.

You can call Antidote from your other software in the following ways.

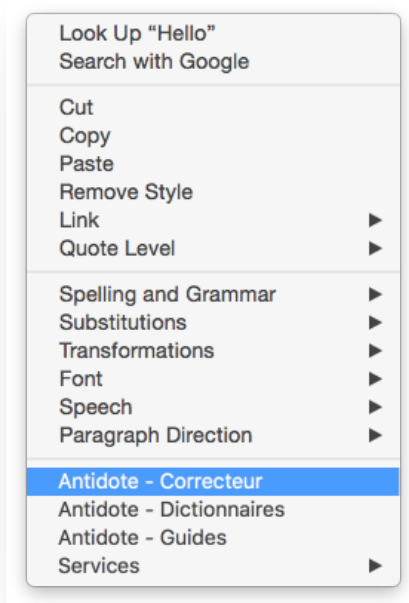
Mechanism	Description
The Antidote Agent	The Antidote Agent is installed in the menu bar. The Agent enables Antidote to be accessed from many applications.
The context menu	Antidote integrates with the system's context menu, which can be viewed from most applications; all you need to do is right-click.
Services	You can access Antidote within any application that is compatible with the Services menu.
The Dock	All of Antidote's resources are accessible from the Dock menu.
The toolbar	Call Antidote's resources from the toolbar, which is accessible within most applications.
Copy and paste	Use the clipboard to transfer the text to be corrected to Antidote, or the word to be looked up.
Drag and drop	Drag the text to be corrected or the word to be looked up directly into Antidote's resources.

APPLICATION-SPECIFIC INTEGRATION

Antidote installs connectors that are specifically adapted to the context of certain software applications. Read the pages devoted to those applications to optimize your use of Antidote with them.

THE CONTEXT MENU

Antidote installs a context menu that is accessible within most applications.



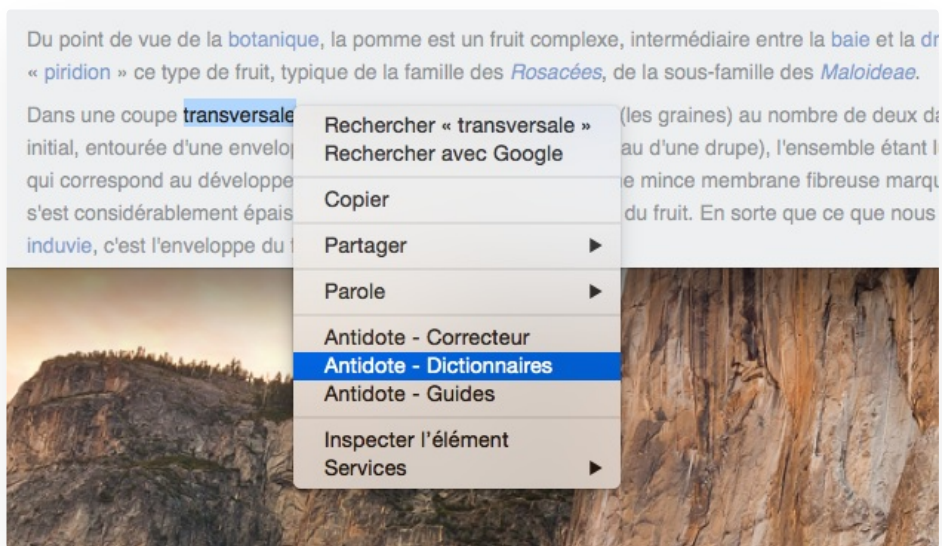

ACCESSING ANTIDOTE'S RESOURCES FROM THE CONTEXT MENU

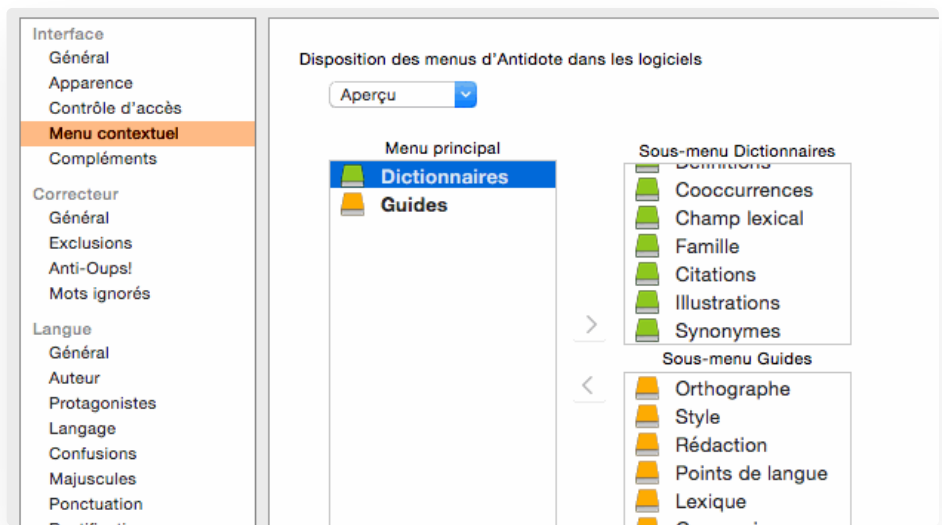
1. Select the text to be corrected or the word to be looked up.
1. Click the right mouse button (or hold down the **ctrl** key while clicking).
1. In the context menu that opens, Antidote's resources are in the lower section.
1. Select the desired resource.



Note – With certain programs, Antidote first copies the text into a working document in order to make its corrections. After the correction is completed, to import the changes, copy and paste the result into the original document.

CUSTOMIZING THE CONTEXT MENU

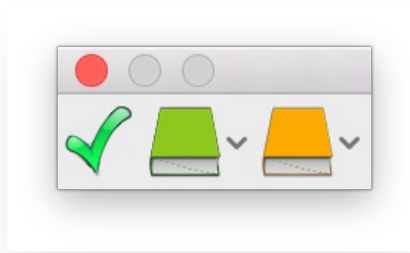
The context menu panel in Antidote’s settings allows you to personalize the context menu, e.g. by adding direct access to synonyms or conjugation.



Note – customizing the context menu in Chrome is done **directly in the application**

THE TOOLBAR

You can access Antidote’s resources from the toolbar, which is available within most applications.

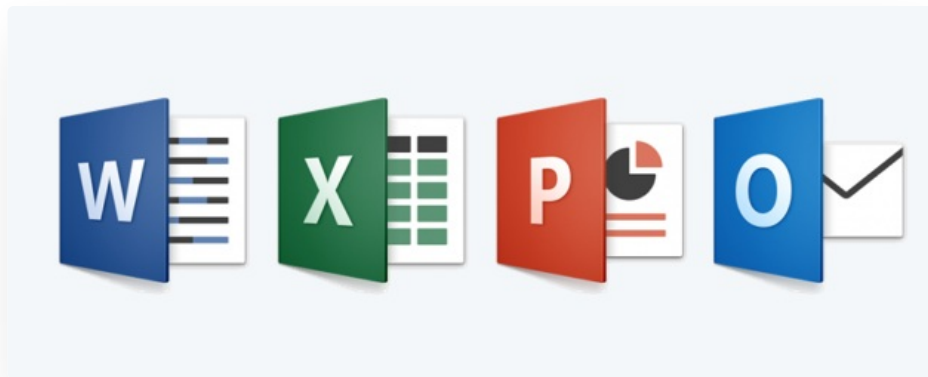


In some applications, the toolbar is floating, which allows you to move it by dragging it by the title bar.

You can close the floating toolbar. You can reopen it with the Antidote Agent.

MICROSOFT OFFICE

Antidote integrates with Word, Excel, PowerPoint and Outlook.



Interaction with Antidote is mainly via the [toolbar](#) and the [context menu](#). In both cases, place the cursor at the beginning of the text to correct or the word to be looked up, then call Antidote's resources by the method of your choice.

Note – If the Antidote bar does not appear, select "Show Antidote bar" from the context menu (right-click or **ctrl** + click).

FEATURES SPECIFIC TO POWERPOINT

You can call Antidote on the following selections:

- on text within a frame or on the entire frame;
- on all the frames in a slide (with **⌘** + **A** or in Outline mode);
- on all the slides beginning with the one currently displayed (by clicking on the background of the slide);
- on text in the presentation's notes.

FEATURES PARTICULAR TO EXCEL (TEXT CORRECTION)

When the corrector is called:

- If an empty cell is selected, Antidote will correct the entire sheet, including comments and charts.
- If non-empty cells are selected, Antidote will only correct those cells.
- If a chart is selected, Antidote will correct the titles and names on the chart's axes.

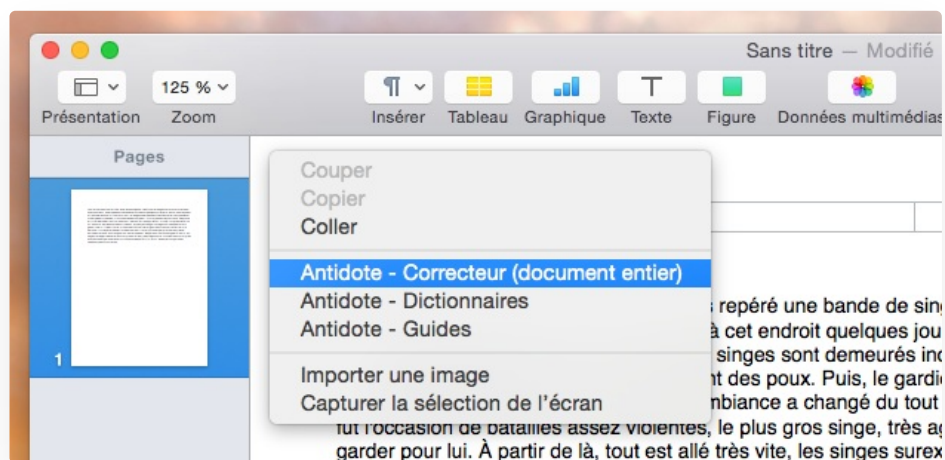
Note 1 – Antidote cannot be called while editing a cell. Numerical cells are ignored.

Note 2 – In Excel for Mac, Antidote cannot correct a cell containing more than 256 characters. Antidote will flag any corrections, but you have to introduce them manually.

PAGES, KEYNOTE AND NUMBERS

CORRECTING A PAGES DOCUMENT



To correct the entire document, nothing must be selected. Then:

- click in the upper left corner of the document;
- display the page thumbnails and then click on them.

You can also limit your selection to:

- text within a text box;
- one or more complete text boxes.

Then display the context menu by right-clicking (or **ctrl** + click) and select the desired Antidote resource.

CORRECTING A KEYNOTE DOCUMENT

To correct the entire presentation, first click in the margin of a slide to deselect everything.

You can also limit your selection to:

- text within a text box;
- one or more complete text boxes;
- one or more slides in the Navigator.

Then display the context menu by right-clicking (or **ctrl** + click) and select the desired Antidote reference.

CORRECTING A NUMBERS DOCUMENT

To correct the entire document, first click in the margin of a sheet to deselect everything.

You can also limit your selection to:

- text within a text box or a cell;
- one or more text boxes, cells or complete tables;
- a sheet in the sheet selector.

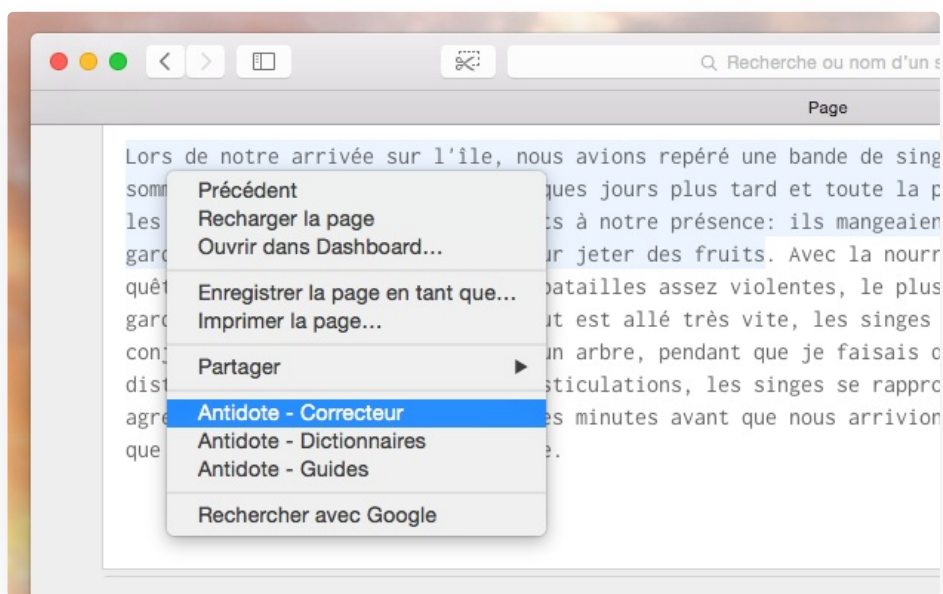
Then display the context menu by right-clicking (or **ctrl** + click) and select the desired Antidote reference.

Note — numerical cells and cells containing a formula are not corrected.

THE CONTEXT MENU IN NUMBERS AND KEYNOTE UNDER MACOS EL CAPITAN (10.11)

Certain [technical limitations](#) prevent the addition of Antidote commands to the context menu of Numbers and Keynote under macOS El Capitan. It is still possible to interact with Antidote via the [Services menu](#), or by using copy and paste.

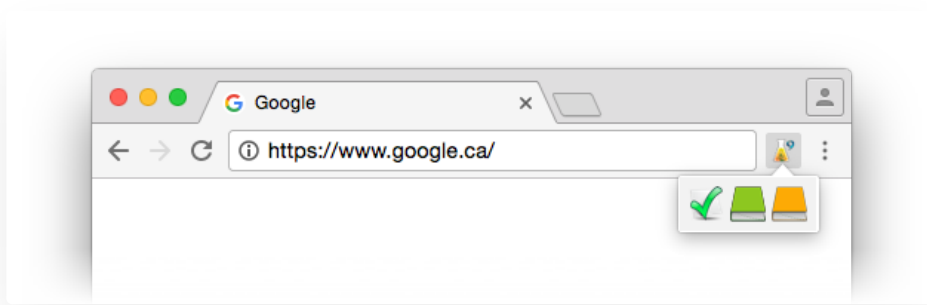
To call Antidote's resources, select the text to be corrected or the word to be looked up, then use one of the following:

- [the context menu](#) (right-click);
- [the Antidote Agent](#);
- [the buttons in the toolbar](#).

Note — If the Antidote toolbar does not appear, click the icon of the Antidote Agent, then select the "Show Antidote toolbar."

GOOGLE CHROME

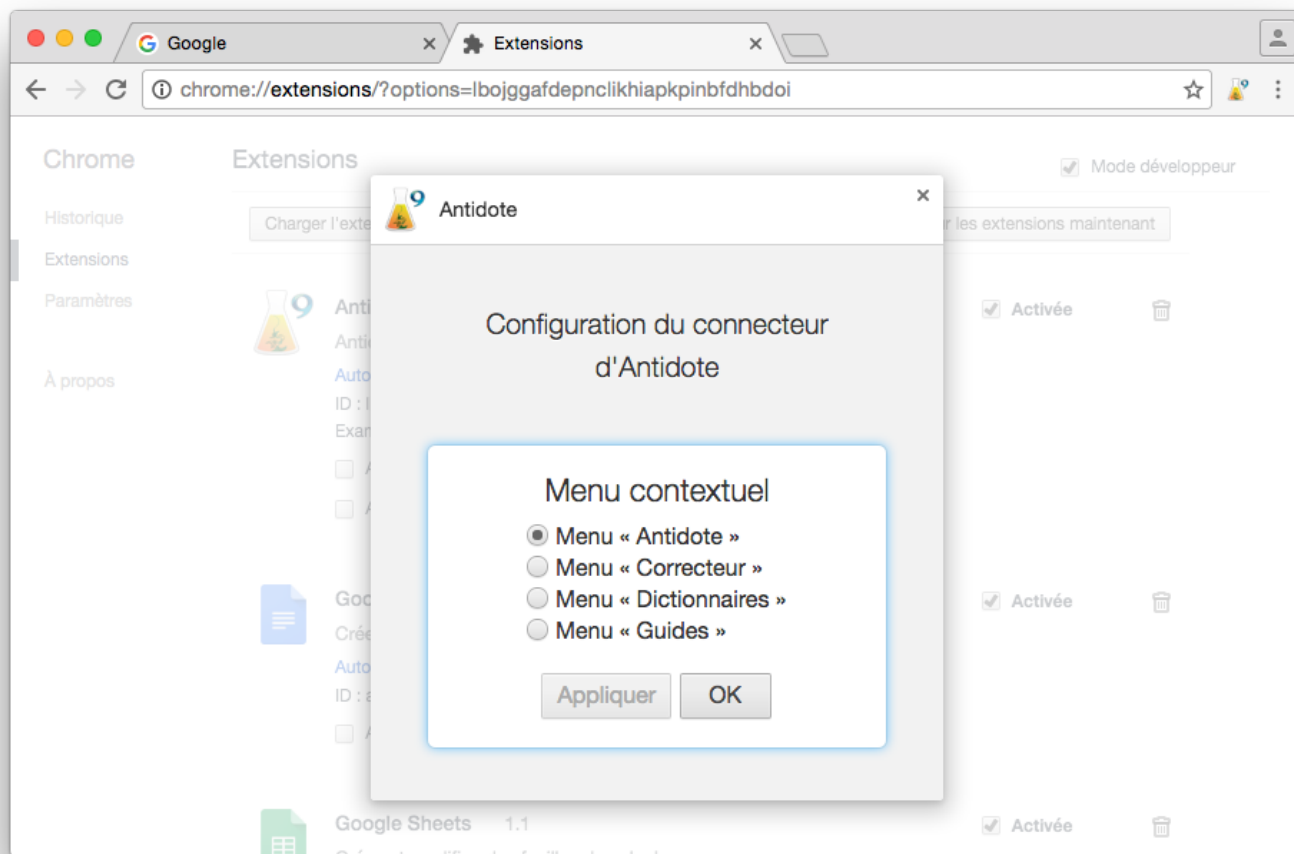
Antidote integrates with Google Chrome by means of an extension which adds an icon to the toolbar and certain elements to the context menu.



CHROME'S CONTEXT MENU

Access to Antidote via Chrome's context menu is similar to the [standard context menus](#), except for one point: customizing this menu is done directly in Chrome, as follows.

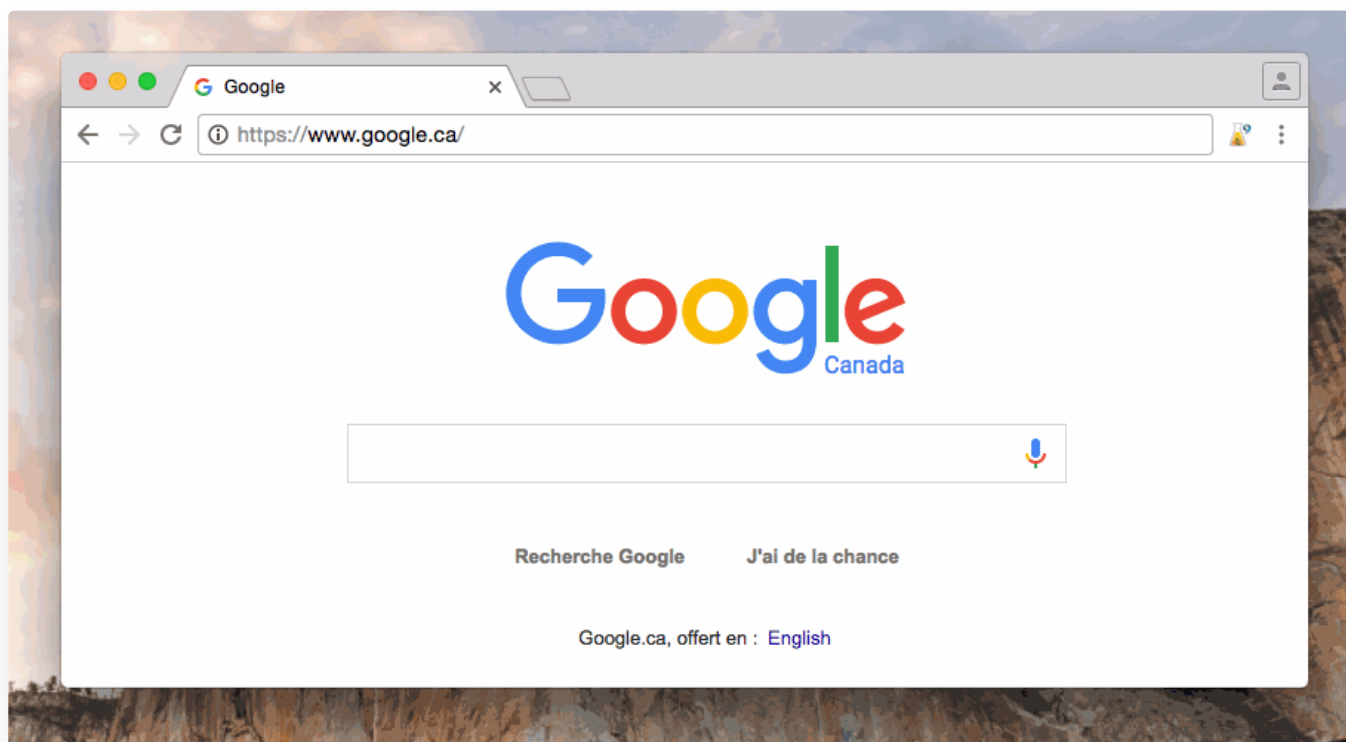
1. Right-click the Antidote icon in the toolbar.
1. Click Options.
1. Choose an option.
1. Click Apply.
1. Close the options tab.

1. Click the tools icon.
1. Select the menu item "Search for updates".



LIBREOFFICE AND NEOOFFICE

Antidote integrates with the Writer, Calc, Impress and Draw modules of LibreOffice and NeoOffice.



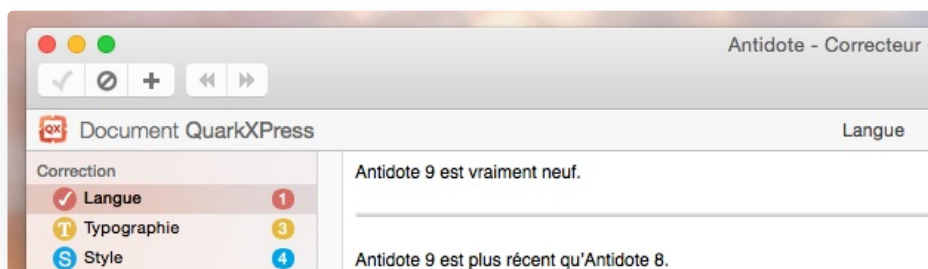
ACCESSING ANTIDOTE'S RESOURCES

Place the cursor at the desired location in the document, then call Antidote's resources using the buttons in the [toolbar](#) or in the [context menu](#).

QUARKXPRESS

The [Antidote Agent](#) is the suggested means of interacting with Antidote from QuarkXPress.

Select the text to correct or the word to be looked up, then call Antidote's resources from the menu of the Antidote Agent.



Note – Antidote displays all the corrected text boxes in sequence.

LATEX

Antidote can process a document containing standard LaTeX commands.

1. In the editor you use for your LaTeX document, select the text to be corrected and then call Antidote by any of the usual methods (context menu, Antidote Agent, Services menu, Dock menu ...).
1. Correct the document normally. The corrections should be reflected directly in your editor, without affecting the formatting instructions.

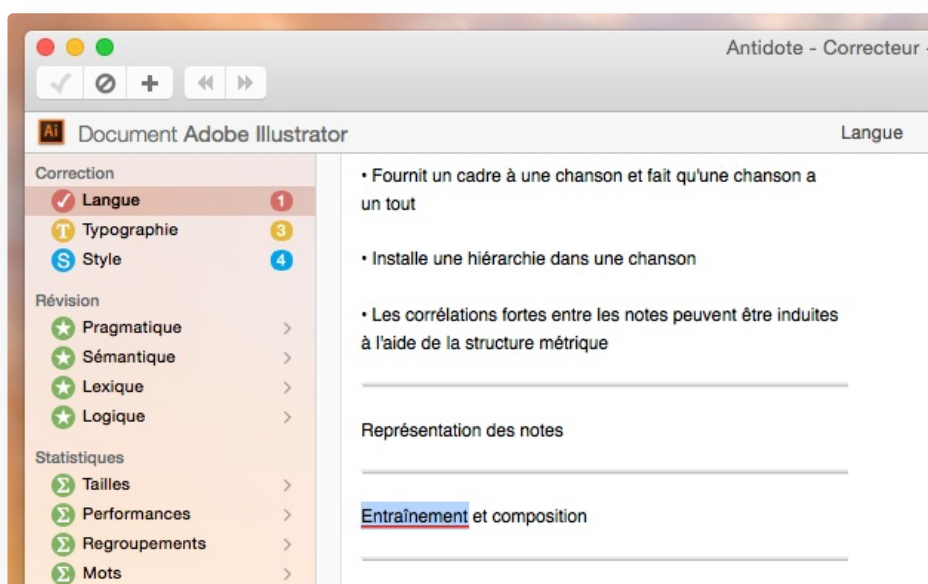
Notes :

- If your editor cannot connect with Antidote, you can copy and paste the text (including formatting instructions) into Antidote's internal editor, and then copy and paste the corrected version back into your editor.
- Antidote recognizes the 7-bit ASCII accent sequences used by TeX (eg `e), but these can be difficult to correct. If so, you may have to make these corrections manually.

ILLUSTRATOR, INDESIGN AND INCOPY

The following table shows how to call Antidote from Illustrator, InDesign and InCopy. For Illustrator, access via the context menu is replaced by shortcuts in the Edit menu.

CORRECTING TEXT WITHIN ILLUSTRATOR

- If a portion of text is selected, Antidote only corrects that text.
- If the cursor is in a block of text, the correction starts at the sentence where the cursor is located and continues to the end of the block.
- If no block of text is selected, Antidote corrects the entire document.

Note — Antidote displays all corrected text blocks in sequence.

CORRECTING TEXT WITHIN INDESIGN

- If a part of the text is selected, Antidote only corrects that part.
- If the cursor is in a text block, the correction starts at the sentence where the cursor is located and continues to the end of the document.
- If no block of text is selected, Antidote corrects the entire document.

Note — Antidote displays all corrected text blocks in sequence.

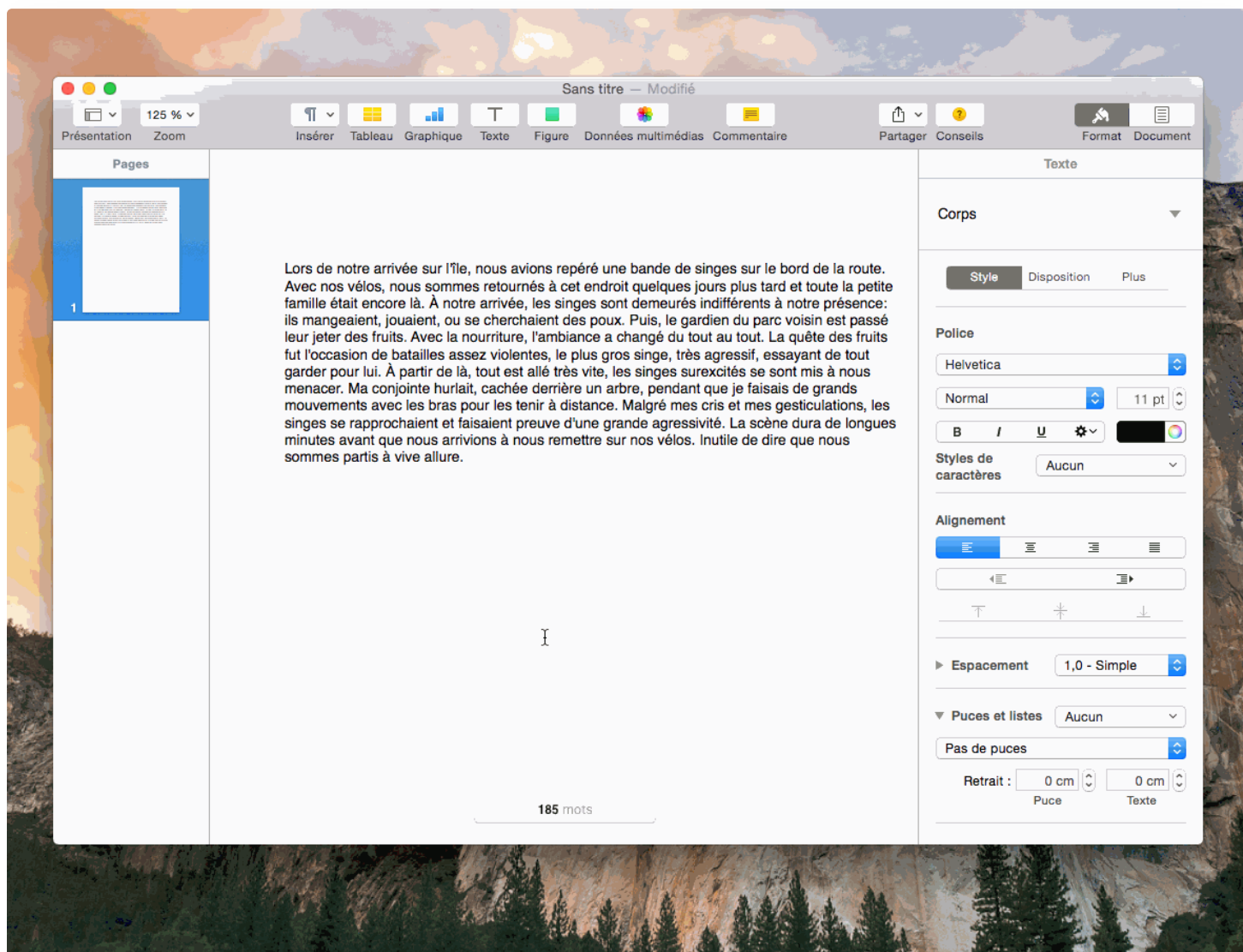
CORRECTING TEXT WITHIN INCOPY

- If a part of the text is selected, Antidote only corrects that part.
- If no text is selected, Antidote corrects the entire document.

COPY AND PASTE TEXT TO ANTIDOTE

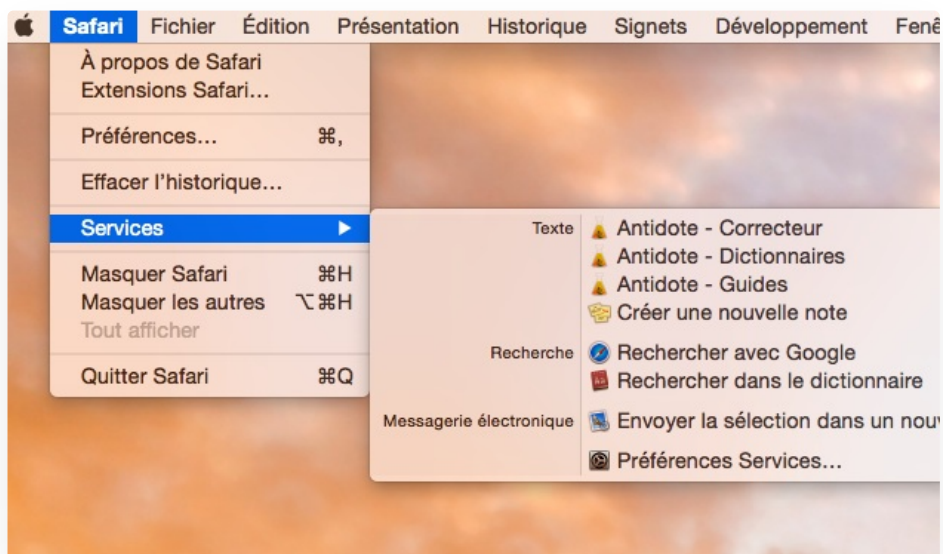
You can copy and paste text between most software applications and Antidote.

1. In your application, select the text to be corrected, then copy it to the clipboard.
1. In Antidote, create an internal document. (⌘ + n)
1. Paste the text to be corrected into this document.
1. Call the corrector.
1. Once the correction is complete, copy the corrected text back into your original document. (Warning: some formatting may be lost.)



SERVICES

Antidote can be accessed from any application that is compatible with the Services menu in macOS.



ACTIVATION

To display Antidote's resources within the macOS Services menu:

1. Click System Preferences.
1. Click Keyboard.
1. Select Services in the list on the left.
1. Check the desired services:
 - Antidote – Corrector
 - Antidote – Dictionaries
 - Antidote – Guides

Note – Antidote already inserts its commands in the context menu of most applications. In such cases, the Service commands may appear in duplicate. The first are generally preferable.

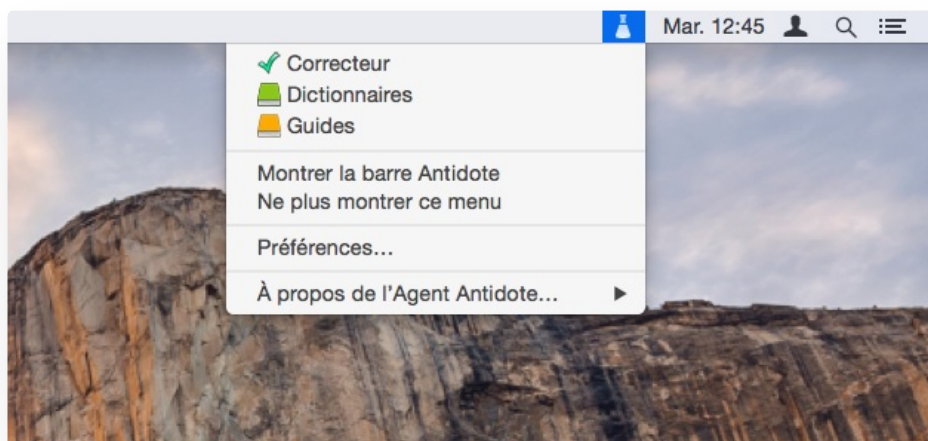
USE

1. Select the text to be corrected or the word to be looked up.
1. Right-click (or Ctrl+click) on the selected text. In the context menu that opens, select the desired resource.
1. Antidote opens that resource.

Note – The corrector will sometimes copy the text into a working document before correcting it. If so, you will need to copy and paste the corrections back into the original document. Some formatting may be lost when the text is transferred to Antidote.

THE ANTIDOTE AGENT

The Antidote Agent is installed in the menu bar. The Agent allows for Antidote's integration with many applications.



USE

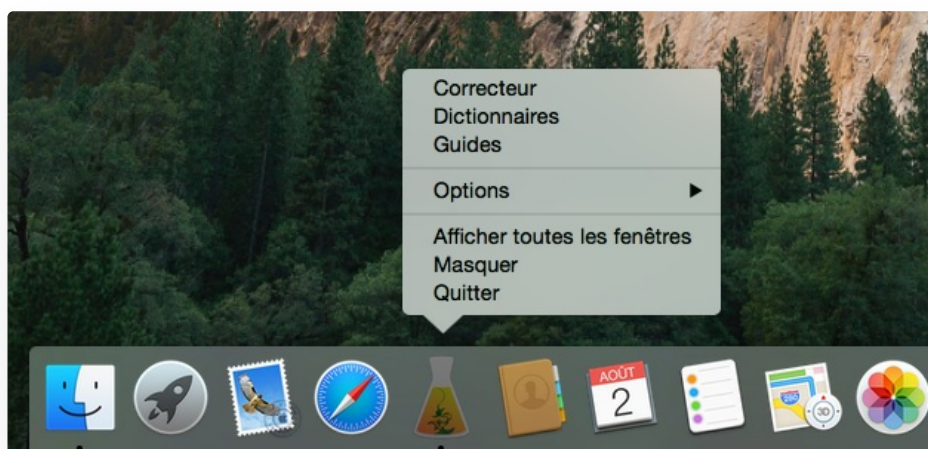
1. Select the word to be looked up or the text to be corrected.
1. In the menu bar, click the icon of the Antidote Agent to open its menu.
1. From the menu, select the desired Antidote resource.

The Antidote Agent menu can be used in place of Antidote's floating menu bar or access via the context menu; it is functionally equivalent to them.

Note — An exclamation mark is superimposed over the icon if the Antidote Agent is no longer functioning. In this case, click on the icon and select the Quit option that appears at the bottom of the menu. To restart the Agent, quit and then relaunch Antidote.

THE DOCK

Antidote's resources are all accessible from the Dock menu bar.



ACCESSING ANTIDOTE'S RESOURCES FROM THE DOCK MENU BAR

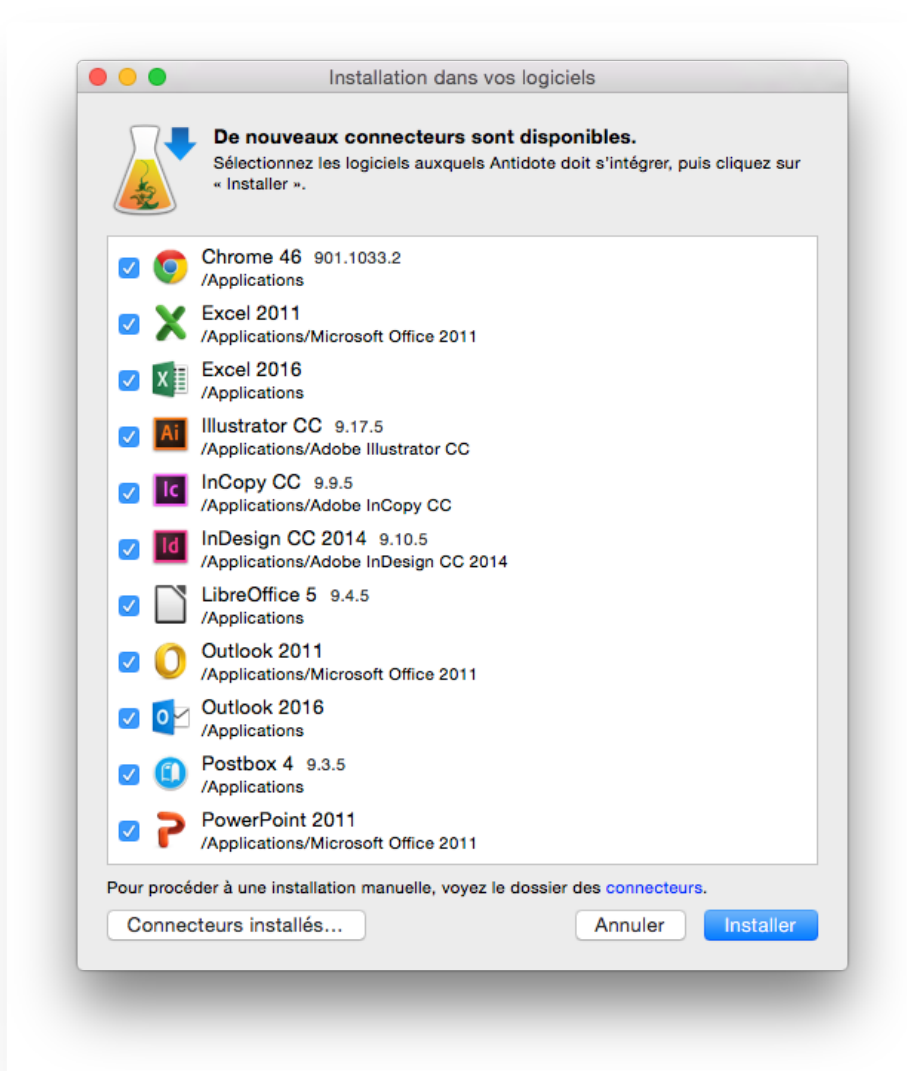
1. Launch Antidote.
1. Select the text to correct or the word to be looked up from within any application (for example, an application that does not implement the macOS Services menu).

1. Use the clipboard to transmit the text to correct or word to be looked up to Antidote.
1. Click the Antidote icon in the Dock while holding down the mouse button, then select the desired resource from the menu. Antidote opens the selected resource. In the case of the corrector, it pastes the text into a working document, then launches the corrector on this document.
1. Introduce the changes by copying and pasting them into the original document.

INSTALLING ANTIDOTE'S CONNECTORS

Antidote automatically installs its connectors in the software you selected during Antidote's installation.

To reinstall Antidote in a given program, choose "Install with your other software ..." from the "Help" menu.



Note — If automatic installation does not work, click the link to the connectors folder; detailed instructions for installing the connectors manually are found in the folder of each program.

INTEGRATION UNDER MACOS 10.11 AND 10.12



INTEGRATION PROBLEMS WITH TEXTEDIT, PAGES, KEYNOTE AND NUMBERS

Beginning with 10.11, Apple introduced SIP (System Integrity Protection), a new barrier designed to protect the system from malicious intrusions. Apple has also chosen to include Pages, Keynote, Numbers, and TextEdit within the scope of SIP. In doing so, Apple closed the door through which Antidote integrated with these four applications.

Druide has succeeded in implementing a new integration for Pages and TextEdit on 10.11. Efforts are underway to enable integration on 10.12 as well. In the meantime, to access Antidote from these applications on 10.12, you must use copy and paste.

LINUX

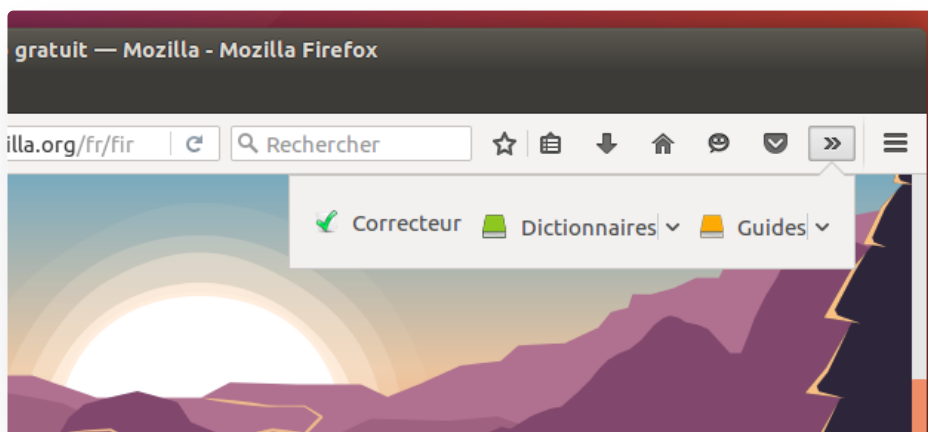
Antidote includes an advanced corrector, dictionaries and language guides, all of which integrate with your software to help you write. This guide will help you learn how to optimize your use of Antidote with your other software.

Connectors adapted to the main Linux software applications can be [installed](#). This is the case for [Chrome](#), [LibreOffice](#), [Firefox](#) and [Thunderbird](#). These connectors add toolbars and context menus to your software applications to optimize access to Antidote.

For other software, you can use the standard operations of [copy and paste](#) and [drag and drop](#) to transmit the text to be corrected or word to be looked up to Antidote.

FIREFOX AND THUNDERBIRD

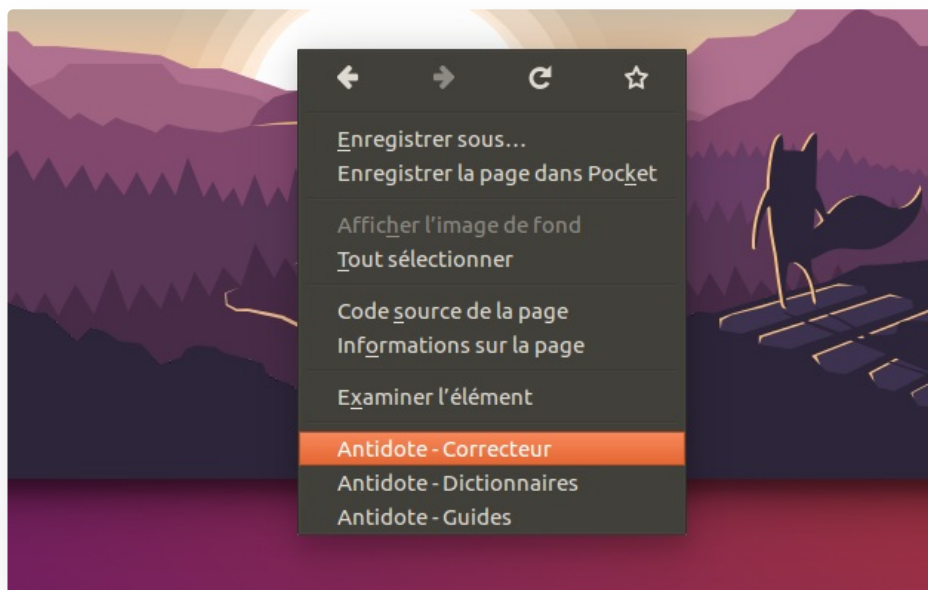
Antidote integrates with Firefox and Thunderbird by means of add-on modules. Once [installed](#), these add icons to the toolbar as well as elements to the context menu.



ACCESSING ANTIDOTE'S RESOURCES

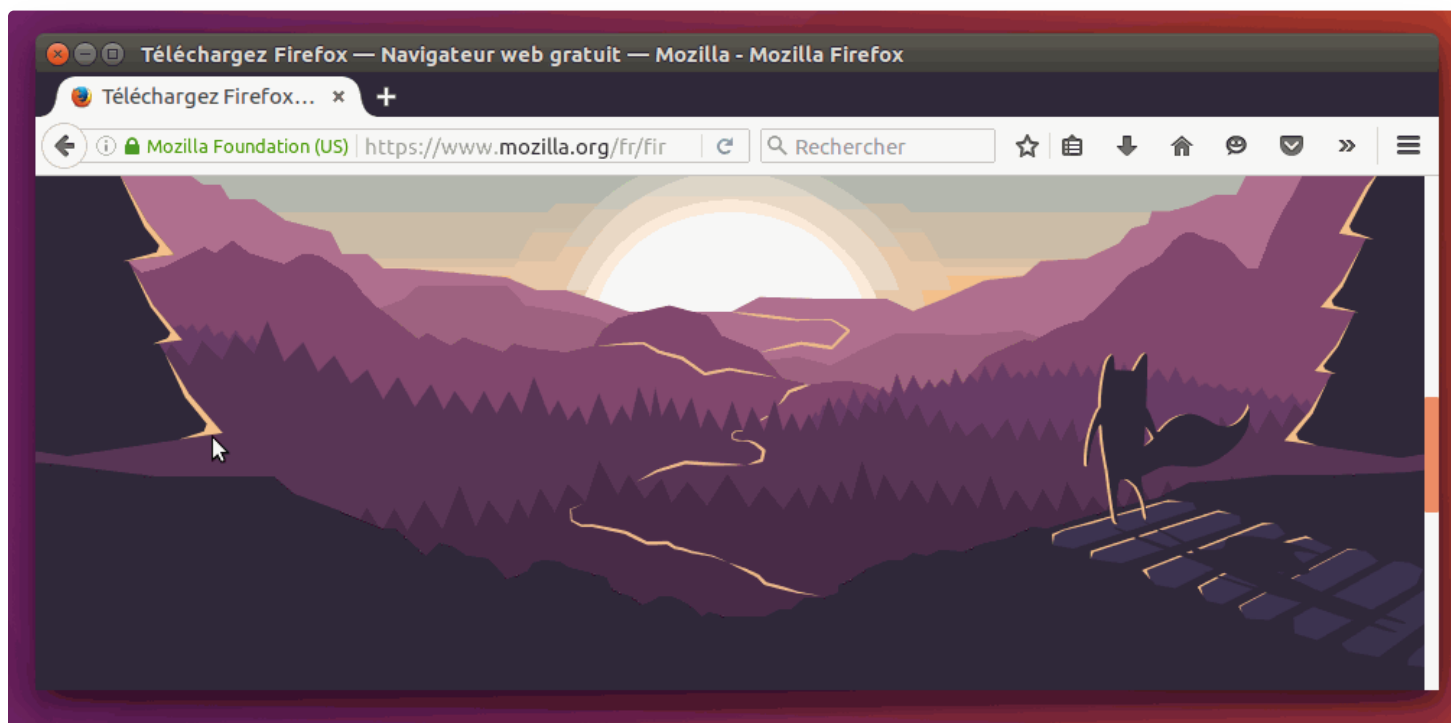
Select the text to correct or the word to be looked up, then call Antidote's resources by means of:

- the buttons in the toolbar;
- the context menu (right click);
- the tools menu (Thunderbird).



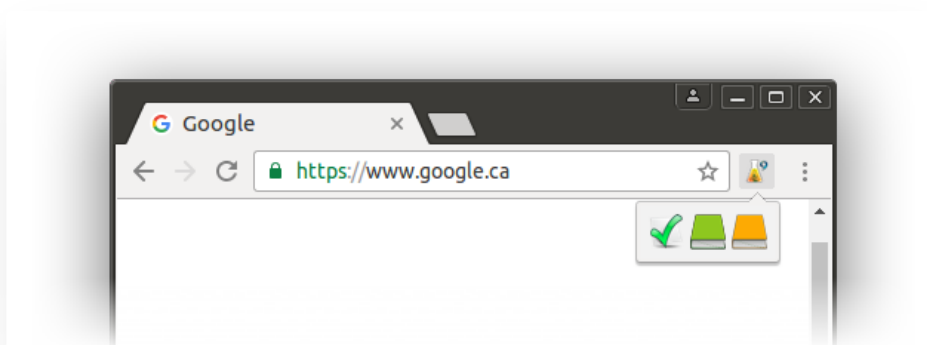
UPDATING THE EXTENSION

1. Within the application, open the menu Tools> Add-ons.
1. Click the "Extensions" tab.
1. Click the tools icon.
1. Select the menu item "Search for updates".



GOOGLE CHROME

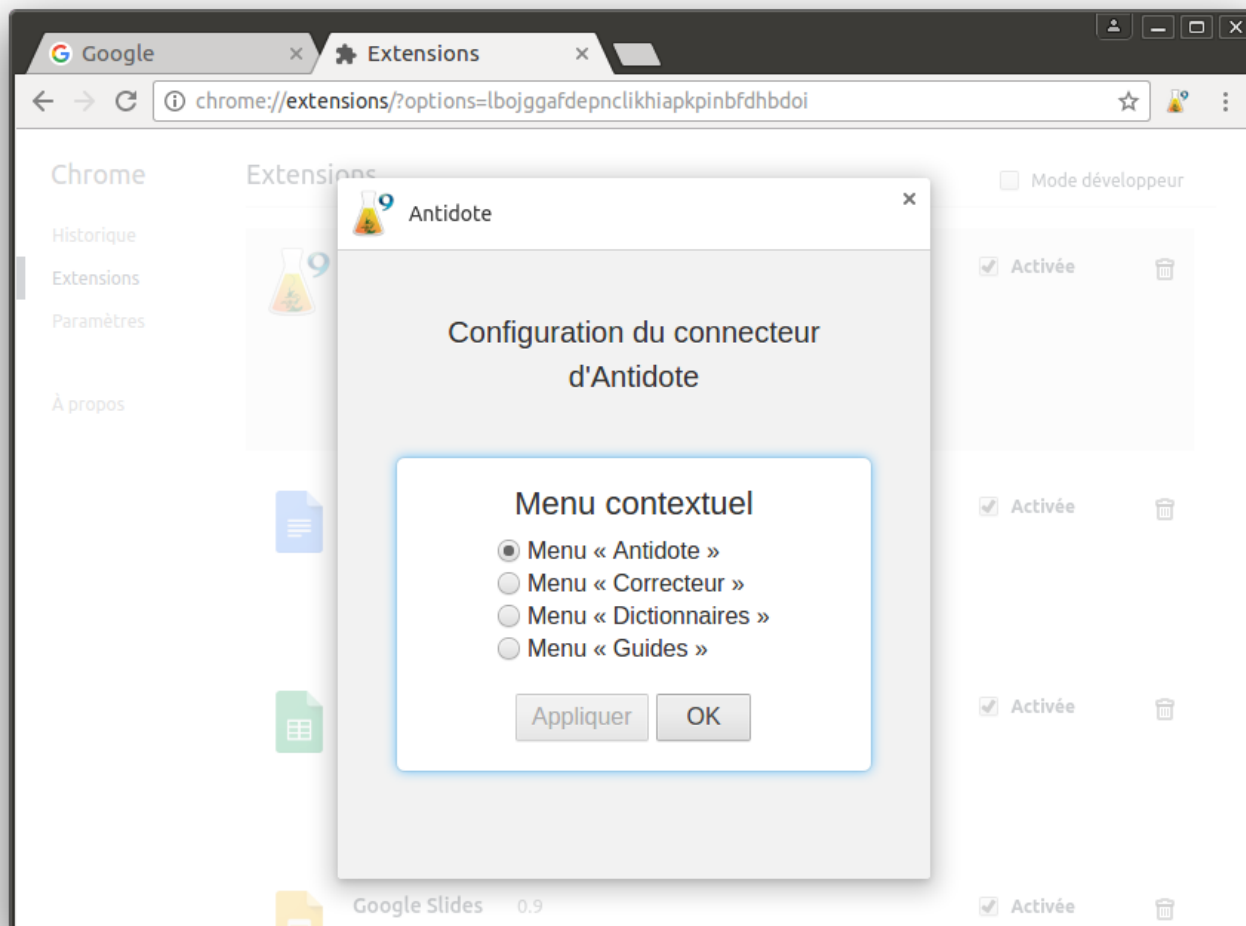
Antidote integrates with Google Chrome by means of an extension. Once [installed](#), the extension adds an icon to the toolbar as well as elements to the context menu.



CHROME'S CONTEXT MENU

Antidote can be accessed from Chrome's context menu. You can change the options offered in this menu as follows:

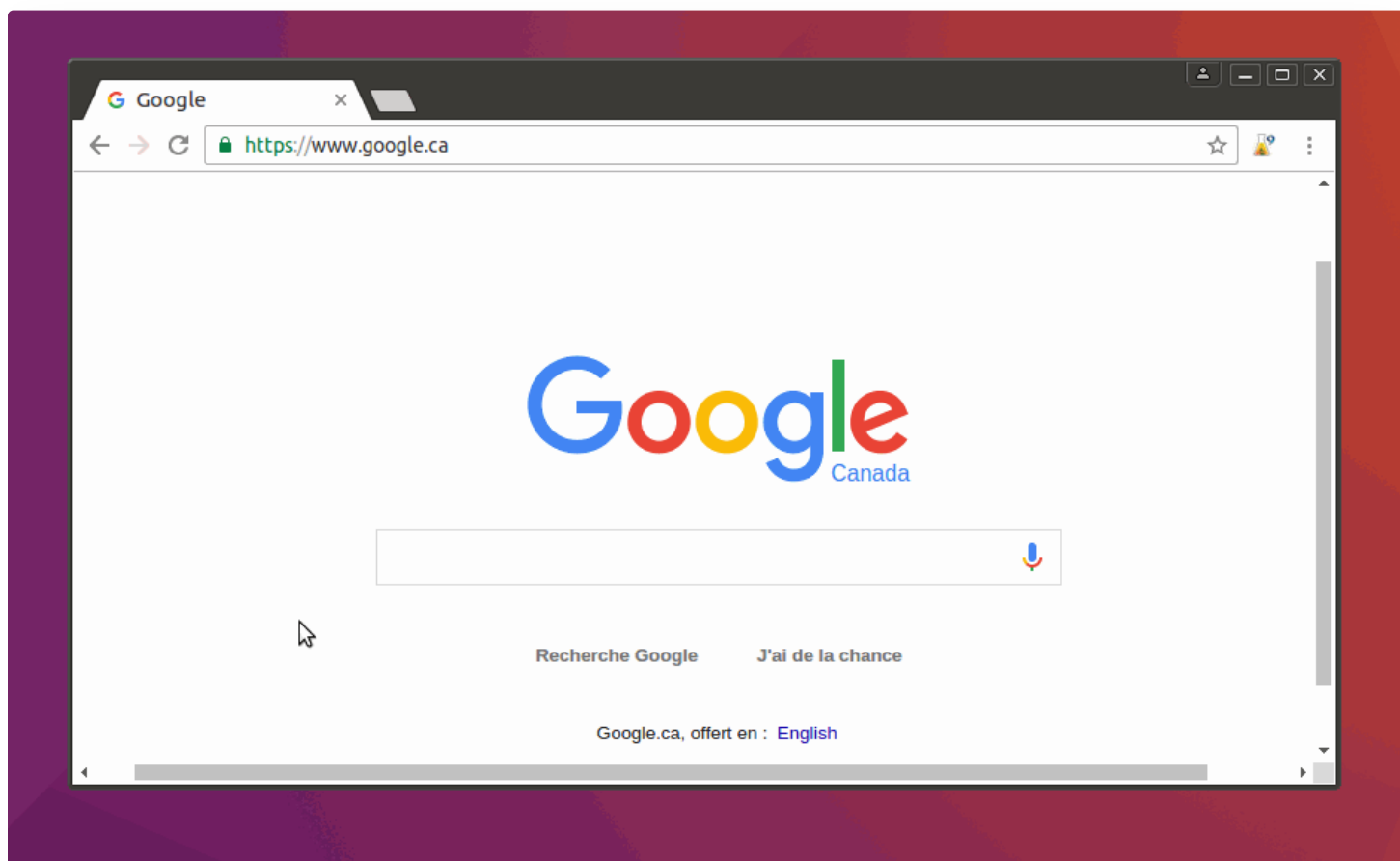
1. Right-click the Antidote icon in the toolbar.
1. Click Options.
1. Choose an option.
1. Click Apply.
1. Close the options tab.



UPDATING THE EXTENSION

Make sure you update the extension regularly.

1. Click Chrome's personalize icon in the upper right corner.
1. Select the menu item "More tools" and then the sub-item "Extensions".
1. Check the "Developer mode" box .
1. Click the "Update extensions now" button.

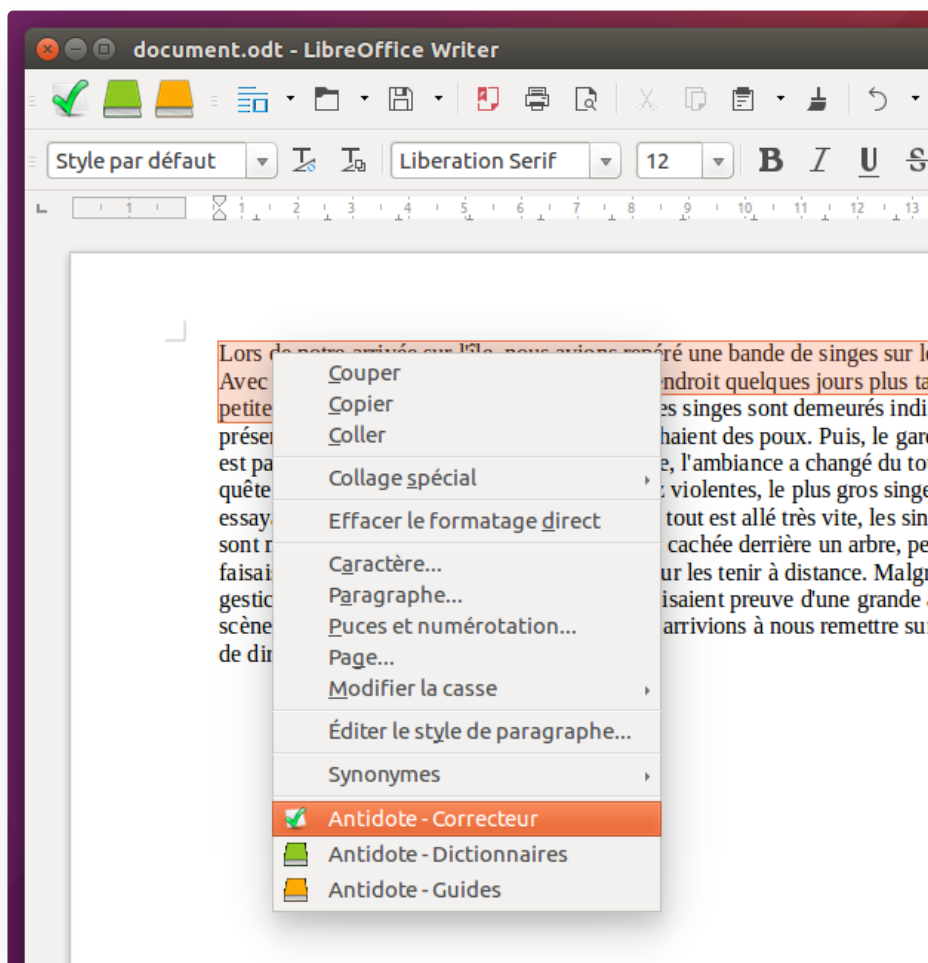

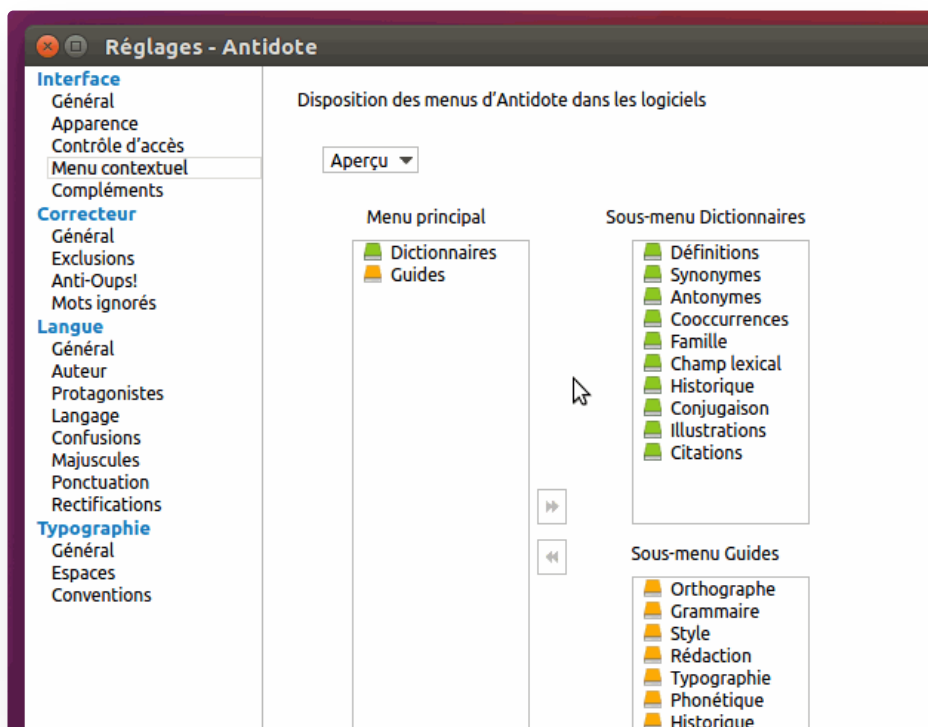

CUSTOMIZING THE CONTEXT MENU

The context menu panel in Antidote's settings allows you to personalize the context menu, e.g. by adding direct access to synonyms or conjugation.



LATEX

Antidote can process a document containing standard LaTeX commands.

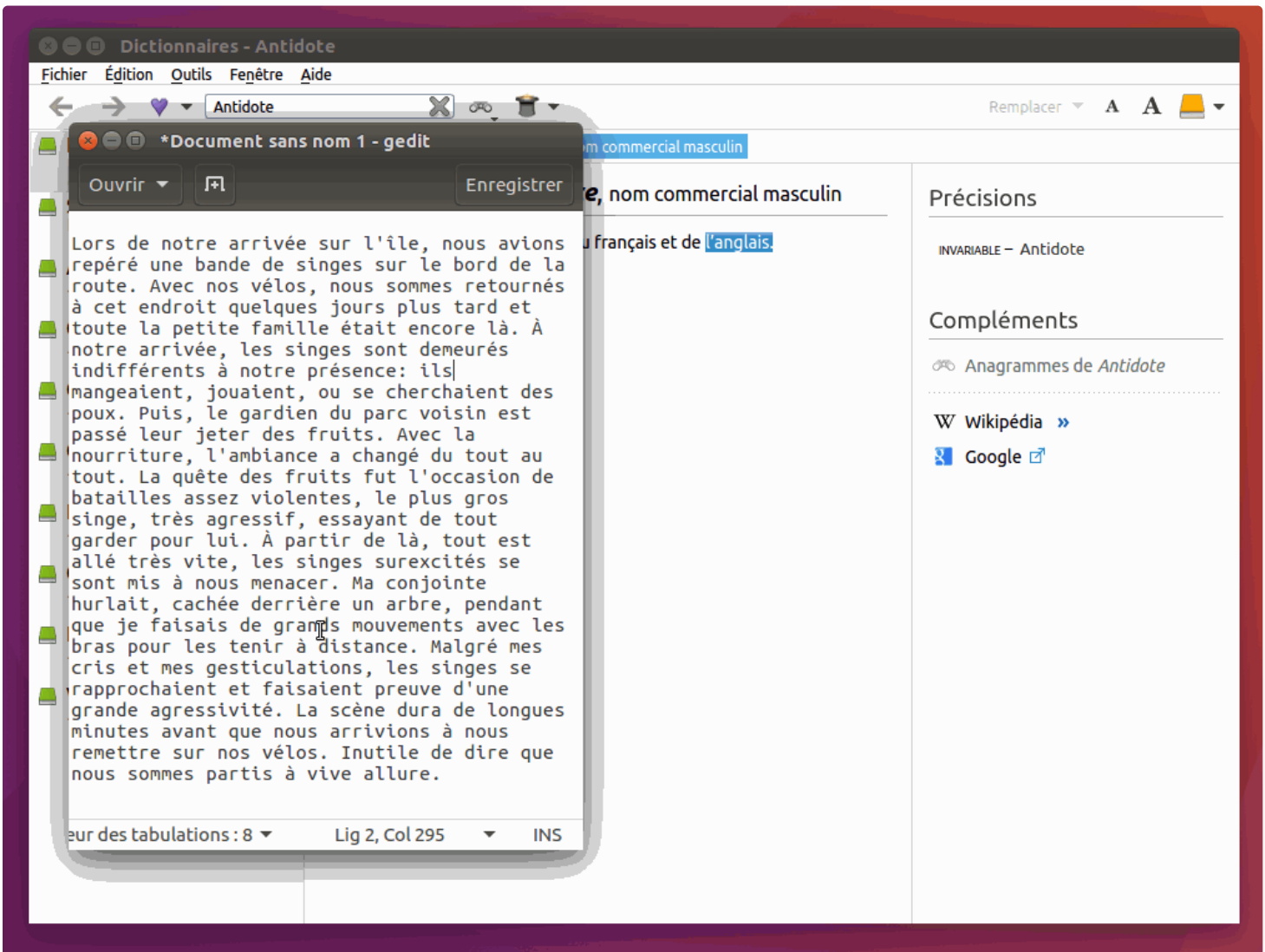
1. In the editor you use for your LaTeX documents, copy the text to be corrected (formatting instructions included), and then paste it into a new document in Antidote's internal editor.
1. Correct the document. The corrections will be made on the copy of the text in Antidote's internal editor.
1. Transfer the corrections by pasting Antidote's corrected text back into your original document.

Note — Antidote recognizes the 7-bit ASCII accent sequences used by TeX (eg `\'e`), but these can be difficult to correct. If so, you may have to make these corrections manually.

COPY AND PASTE TEXT TO ANTIDOTE

You can copy and paste text between most software applications and Antidote.

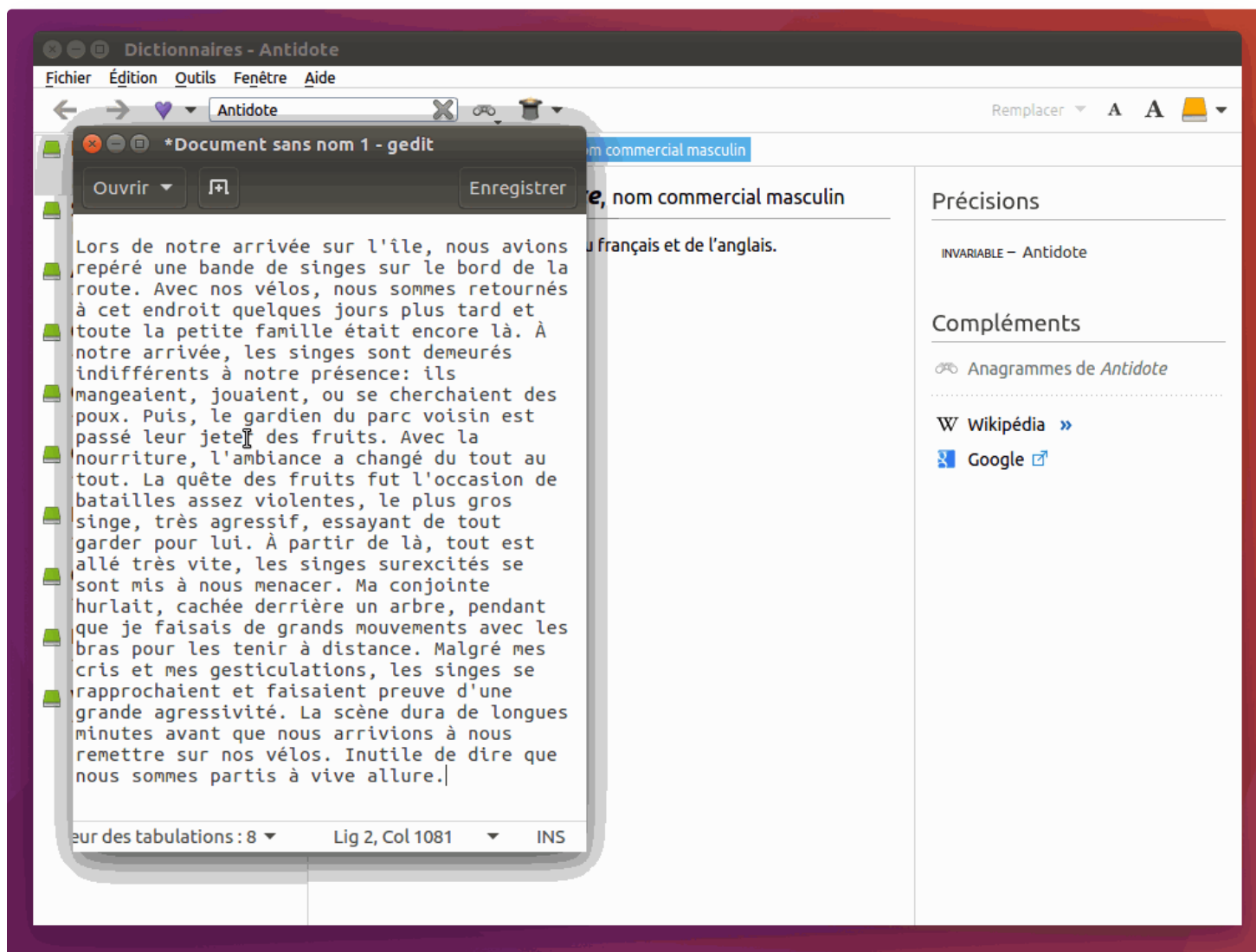
1. In your application, select the text to be corrected, then copy it to the clipboard.
1. In Antidote, create an internal document. (`ctrl + n`)
1. Paste the text to be corrected into this document.

DRAG AND DROP TEXT TO ANTIDOTE

You can drag and drop text between most software applications and Antidote.

1. In Antidote, create an internal document. (**ctrl** + **n**)
1. Drag the text to be corrected into this document.
1. Call the corrector.
1. Drag the corrected text back into your original document. (Warning: some formatting may be lost.)
1. For Antidote's other resources, drag the word to be looked up onto the desired dictionary or into the headword box.



INSTALLING ANTIDOTE'S CONNECTORS

The connectors adapted to the main Linux software applications must be installed manually.

1. From Antidote, open the menu item Help > Install with your other software ...
1. Follow the instructions in the folder specific to each application.
